

# Sports premium 2019-20

## Review of 18-19

Key achievements to date:	Areas for further improvement and baseline evidence of need:
<p>Daily Mile has been introduced across all age groups - increasing the participation in physical activity by at least 10 mins per day</p> <p>Hydrotherapy training with Oily cart was hugely beneficial to pupils and staff</p> <p>More staff now able to lifeguard in the pool</p> <p>School is well resourced with equipment to enable all pupils to participate in physical activities.</p> <p>Coaching programs have improved the range of sports pupils participate in – Primary access to climbing, judo, cricket. This has extended into an increase in off site inter school competition and attendance at festivals for primary age range</p> <p>Pupils are becoming more active during lunchtimes as training for Dinner staff and use of SAFC staff have improved engagement levels lunchtime club introduced on another day</p> <p>SAFC family learning project attended by 8 families</p>	<p>Continue to monitor and promote Daily Mile</p> <p>Revisit Hydro sessions to monitor the quality of provision in different sessions</p> <p>Revisit morning warm up to ensure engagement of all</p> <p>Widen the variety of sports pupils take part in to include Rugby skills, build on outdoor activities for primary pupils – staff supported to engage in outdoor activities within school</p> <p>Continue to build links with school sports partnership in order to access coaching and competitive events.</p> <p>Additional resources to support lunchtime play.</p> <p>Apply for Schools Games Mark</p> <p>Develop sports leaders through the school council - older pupils to support fundraising and organising events for younger pupils</p> <p>Restart Duke of Edinburgh award for targeted pupils</p>
