Re-Opening of School And Expectations Around Behaviour

Following my last communication, the Management Committee met yesterday and approved the risk assessments, required for the re-opening of school, initially to Year 6 and Year 10 children. The earliest planned date to start a return of these pupils is Monday 22nd June at the earliest.

This is dependent on a few control measures being in place by then, including a highly effective track, trace and isolate system launched by the government 7 days ago. We have no control over this measure and are relying on the government to ensure this happens. I will write to you again towards the end of next week to confirm whether we can proceed with our plan for the 22nd June, and with more detailed guidance to ensure we make the re-opening of school as safe as possible for your children.

At the moment, we have started to introduce new routines which are there to ensure we maintain social distancing. Pupils who are attending school are expected to remain in their bubbles and enter and leave the school premises 1 at a time, always maintaining a 2 metre distance from anyone else. All belongings must be handed in (including coats) and stored securely in lockers. Mobile phones, money and any other belongings that are prohibited are kept locked separately for the whole day. I have secured the option of a hot meal from next week and ask that the only container your child brings to school is a water bottle. Pupils are also expected to attend school in clean clothes and to be adhering to government expectations when they are not at school.

I would appreciate your support with the adherence to these rules in order to keep everyone in school as safe as possible. The staff team understand that accidents can happen, however if we feel that a pupil has purposefully broken the rules, there will be a phone call home a pupil may be excluded for a fixed term.
