

REMOTE LEARNING PLAN 2020 - 2021

Where a class, group or small number of pupils need to self-isolate, or there is a local lockdown requiring pupils to remain at home, Monkton Infants has the capacity to offer immediate remote education as outlined in this plan. Remote learning does not have to be purely digital.

<u>AIMS</u>	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • To provide a curriculum sequence that allows access to high quality online and offline resources, linked to the school's curriculum expectations • To utilise online tools which can be used consistently across school in order to allow interaction, assessment and feedback • To provide printed resources for pupils without suitable online access • To ensure all pupils, including pupils with SEND, have equal access to remote education and high quality education resources

Access to devices/ internet at home	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Questionnaire completed by all parents/ carers as to access at home – September 2020 • Remote learning will include online/ offline learning • Devices available through DfE for: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Clinically extremely vulnerable children across all year groups who are shielding on official advice ○ Children in all year groups unable to access remote education whilst attending school on a hospital site
Access to remote learning	<p><u>Online:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Via 'Class Dojo' – using 'Class Story'/ individual pupil portfolios • Via purchased apps – 'Reading Eggs', 'Mathletics' • Via commercial programs – 'Teach Your Monster to Read' 'BBC Bitesize', 'Oak Academy' 'Oxford Owl E-Books', 'White Rose Premium', 'Lexia' <p><u>Offline:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Via worksheets/ work packs – either collected from school by prior arrangement or delivered home

Contact: school - home	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • At least once a week; via ‘Class Dojo’ or phone • If using telephone contact, the school phone must be used, not personal mobiles
Differentiation	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Work/ learning activities set for each ability group – clearly demarcated on ‘Class Dojo’ • Differentiated work packs distributed according to ability • Work sheets/ tasks provided for each ability group – online/ offline
Content	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • All activities/ tasks will be meaningful and sequenced, in line with usual curriculum expectations • Pupils in Yr 2 will receive remote education in all subject areas • Younger pupils will focus mainly on reading, writing and maths learning • Clear explanations of new content will be provided by classteachers – using audio recording or written instructions • Learning programmes will be of equivalent length to the core teaching pupils receive in school and will avoid an over-reliance on long-term projects and internet research activities
Assessment/ Marking/ Feedback	<p><u>Online:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Via ‘Class Dojo’ - portfolio of individual work/ individual comments by classteacher • Via the level attained in the app/ commercial program <p><u>Offline:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Work packs/ completed activities may be returned to school at an arranged time to enable classteacher to assess progress. • Feedback may be made via a weekly phone call home
Frequency of work/ activities set	<p><u>Online:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A weekly plan will be uploaded by the classteacher each Friday to outline the daily learning for the following week <p><u>Offline:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Work packs may be collected/ returned to school either weekly or fortnightly, by prior arrangement, depending on personal situations/ preference
