

Covid-19 related pupil absence

A quick reference guide for parents and staff (September 2020)

What to do if...	Action Needed	Return to school when...
<p>...my child has Covid-19 symptoms.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A high temperature – above 37.8^oC • A new, continuous cough – coughing a lot for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours • A loss or change to sense of smell or taste – cannot smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste different to normal 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Do not come to school - Contact school to inform us - Get a test as soon as possible - Stay at home and do not have visitors. - Self-isolate the whole household - Inform the school immediately about the test result <p>Book a test</p>	<p>...the test comes back negative or a period of 10 days has passed since the symptoms started, and the child feels well.</p>
<p>...my child tests positive for Covid-19.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Do not come to school. - Contact school to inform us. - Self-isolate the whole household. Anyone you live with must self-isolate for 14 days from when child started self-isolating. 	<p>...10 days have passed since symptoms began, even if they still have a cough or loss of taste/smell. <i>(These symptoms can last for several weeks.)</i></p> <p>OR</p> <p>.... 10 days have passed since test if the child didn't have any symptoms</p>
<p>...my child tests negative for Covid-19.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Contact school to inform us. - 	<p>...the test comes back negative.</p>
<p>...my child is ill with symptoms not linked to Covid-19.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Do not come to school. - Contact school to inform us. - Ring on each day of illness. 	<p>...after 48 hours following the last bout of sickness or diarrhoea (as per attendance policy)</p>
<p>...someone in my household has Covid-19 symptoms.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Do not come to school. - Contact school to inform us. - Self-isolate the whole household. - Household to get a test. - Inform school immediately about test result. 	<p>...the test comes back negative.</p>
<p>...someone in my household tests positive for Covid-19.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Do not come to school. - Contact school to inform us. - Self-isolate the whole household. 	<p>...the child has completed 14 days of isolation.</p>
<p>...NHS test and trace has identified my child as a close contact of somebody with symptoms or confirmed Covid-19.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Do not come to school. - Contact school to inform us. - Self-isolate for 14 days 	<p>...the child has completed 14 days of isolation.</p>
<p>...NHS test and trace has identified a household member (other than my child) as a close contact of somebody with symptoms or confirmed Covid-19.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - The household member must self-isolate for 14 days. - Child can continue to attend school as long as the household member doesn't develop symptoms. 	<p>...child can continue to attend school</p>
<p>... a sibling attending another school has been sent home to self-isolate due to their being a positive case in their school.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Sibling must self-isolate for 14 days. - Cardinal Wiseman child(ren) can continue to attend as long as sibling doesn't develop symptoms 	<p>...child can continue to attend school</p>
<p>... my child has travelled abroad from a country or territory that is NOT on the exempt list of countries.</p>	<p>If returning from a destination where quarantine is needed*:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - minimum of 14 days self-isolation for all those who travelled. 	<p>...the quarantine period of 14 days has been completed.</p>

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - contact school to inform us you are back in the country and we will agree an earliest date for possible return to school. - Self-isolate the whole household. <p>*Foreign, Commonwealth & Development Office (FCDO) – for up to date travel information</p>	
... my child has travelled abroad from a country or territory that IS on the exempt list of countries.	<p>If returning from a destination where quarantine is NOT needed:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Check the current Exempt countries and territories list to confirm the country you have travelled from or through is on the exempt list. 	...child can continue to attend school
...I have travelled from a country that requires us to quarantine (but my child didn't travel).	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - The person who has travelled MUST NOT leave the house for 14 days, including to do pick-ups and drop offs (<i>please contact school if you need support getting your child to school</i>). - As long as you do not have / have not had symptoms in the last 14 days, your child can continue to attend school. 	...child can continue to attend school
...we have received medical advice that my child must resume shielding.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Do not come to school. - Contact school to inform us. - Provide school with copy of letter - Shield until you are informed that restrictions are lifted and shielding is paused again. 	...you receive medical advice that your child may return to school.
...my child's bubble is closed due to a Covid-19 outbreak in school.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Child must not come to school. - Support your child at home with remote education provided by your school. - Your child will need to self-isolate for 14 days. - Siblings in other year groups may continue to attend school as long as child doesn't develop symptoms 	...school inform you that the bubble will be reopened.
... I am unable to get a test for someone in the household who has symptoms	<p><i>If you are not able to get a test in the first 5 days of having symptoms, your child and anyone they live with must stay at home and self-isolate for 14 days. Anyone in your support bubble must also stay at home.</i></p>	...the child has completed 14 days of isolation.
