Reading the Gospel from this Sunday's Mass

A reading from the Gospel according to John 20:19-23

In the evening of the first day of the week, the doors were closed in the room where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews. Jesus came and stood among them. He said to them, 'Peace be with you', and showed them his hands and his side. The disciples were filled with joy when they saw the Lord, and he said to them again, 'Peace be with you.'

'As the Father sent me,
so am I sending you.'

After saying this he breathed on them and said:

'Receive the Holy Spirit.
For those whose sins you forgive,
they are forgiven;
for those whose sins you retain,
they are retained.'

Reflection

This passage could be seen as John's version of Pentecost. Here we see a description of Jesus breathing the Holy Spirit onto the disciples which is similar to God breathing life into Adam in Genesis. In this way Jesus is seen as giving new life in the Holy Spirit.

Discussion Points

- Why do you suppose the disciples had the doors locked?
- How did the disciples respond when Jesus appeared in their midst?
- What are some of the ways people can turn others' fear into joy today?
- In John's Gospel this event occurred on the evening after Jesus' resurrection.
- Why was it important for Jesus to show them his hands and side?
- Why do you suppose Jesus said 'Peace be with you' twice to the disciples?
- Where was Jesus sending the disciples?
- How do people today carry on the mission Jesus gave to the disciples?
- How does the Holy Spirit help us spread God's love to others?
- Why is forgiveness an important part of Christ's mission?

Activities

Painting flames with forks

Why not make a picture of flames using a fork.
Use a fork to blob some paint on your paper and then swirl it about.

Holy Spirit mobile

Divide your plate into 3 sections. In the middle section draw the outline of the dove's body. Cut out the dove and the two outside sections. Draw the dove's feet and face onto the body. Stick the outside sections onto the back of the dove to form the wings. Cut out a flame for each gift of the spirit and write a gift on each of the 7 flames: Wisdom, Understanding, Counsel, Knowledge, Fortitude, Piety and Fear of the Lord. Cut out 7 ribbons and attach a flame to the end of each ribbon. Stick these so that they hang from the wings and feet of the dove. Attach a ribbon at the top to make a hanger and there you have your Holy Spirit mobile.
