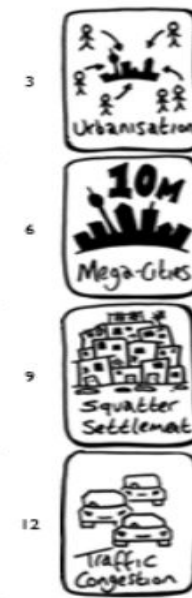
1	 Rural	Countryside area.
4	 Migration	When people move from one area to another. In many LICs people move from rural to urban areas (rural-urban migration).
7	 Social Opportunities	Chances for people to improve their quality of life, for instance access to education and health care.
10	 Sanitation	Measures designed to protect public health, including the provision of clean water and the disposal of sewage and waste.
2	 Urban	Town or city.
5	 Natural Increase	The birth rate minus the death rate of a population.
8	 Economic Opportunities	The degree to which an individual or an area is deprived of services, decent housing, adequate income and local employment.
11	 Pollution	The presence of chemicals, noise, dirt or other substances which have harmful or poisonous effects on an environment.
3	 Urbanisation	The process by which increasing % of a country's population comes to live in towns and cities. Rapid urbanisation is a feature of many LICs and NEEs.
6	 Mega-Cities	An urban area with a total population in excess of ten million people.
9	 Squatter Settlement	An area of poor-quality housing, lacking in formal water supply, sewerage and electricity, which often develops illegally in LIC cities. Also known as a slum.
12	 Traffic Congestion	Occurs when there is too great a volume of traffic for roads to cope with, so traffic jams form and traffic slows to a crawl.

Definitions

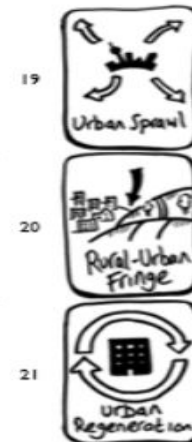
13	 Integrated Transport System	When transport methods connect together, making journeys smooth and therefore public transport more appealing. This increases demand for public transport.
14	 Social Deprivation	Lack of services, decent housing and adequate income and local employment.
15	 Inequalities	Differences between poverty and wealth, as well as in peoples' wellbeing and access to things like jobs, housing and education.
16	 Dereliction	Abandoned buildings and wasteland.
17	 Greenfield	A plot of land, often in a rural or on the edge of an urban area that has not yet been subject to any building development.
18	 Brownfield	Building on land that has been used and abandoned. Commonly found across urban areas, particularly in the inner city.
19	 Urban Sprawl	The unplanned growth of urban areas into the surrounding countryside.
20	 Rural-Urban Fringe	A zone of transition between the built-up area and the countryside, where there is often competition for land use.
21	 Urban Regeneration	The revival of old parts of the built-up area by redeveloping (e.g. by demolishing buildings and starting again).
22	 Sustainable Urban Living	A sustainable city is one in which does minimal damage to the environment, is economically viable and involves the community in decision making.
23	 Waste Recycling	The process of extracting and reusing useful substances found in waste.
24	 Urban Greening	The process of increasing and preserving open space such as public parks and gardens in urban areas.

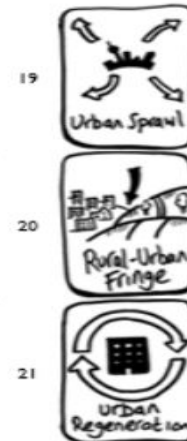
