Medical Doctors

- 1. MBBS/MBBCh degree
- 2. Full registration with the General Medical Council with a licence to practice
- 3. ST2/CT2/GPVTS2 level of training or above
- 4. Ability to work autonomously
- 5. Membership of relevant Royal College desirable
- 6. Prior medical experience in delivering high quality care to patients in developing nations
- 7. Available within 2 weeks of request to respond, for deployments of 2-4 weeks' duration.
- 8. Willingness to work in unstable, insecure areas.
- 9. Able to provide training and supervision to others.
- 10. Flexible and able to manage stress.

Surgeons (including Obstetrics & Gynaecology)

- 1. MBBS/MBBCh degree
- 2. Full registration with the General Medical Council with a licence to practice
- 3. Membership of the Royal College of Surgeons (MRCS)
- 4. ST4 level of training or above*
- 5. To be able to operate independently without supervision
- 6. Prior medical experience in delivering high quality care to patients in developing nations
- 7. Available within 2 weeks of request to respond, for deployments of 2-4 weeks' duration.
- 8. Willingness to work in unstable, insecure areas.
- 9. Able to provide training and supervision to others.
- 10. Flexible and able to manage stress.

Nurses/Midwives

- 1. Bachelor's degree or nursing diploma
- 2. Full registration with the Nursing and Midwifery Council
- 3. Minimum of 2 years' hospital based experience post-qualification
- 4. Prior medical experience in delivering high quality care to patients in developing nations
- 5. Available within 2 weeks of request to respond, for deployments of 2-4 weeks' duration.
- 6. Willingness to work in unstable, insecure areas.
- 7. Able to provide training and supervision to others.
