Medical Doctors

1. MBBS/MBBCh degree
2. Full registration with the General Medical Council with a licence to practice
3. ST2/CT2/GPVT2 level of training or above
4. Ability to work autonomously
5. Membership of relevant Royal College desirable
6. Prior medical experience in delivering high quality care to patients in developing nations
7. Available within 2 weeks of request to respond, for deployments of 2-4 weeks' duration.
8. Willingness to work in unstable, insecure areas.
9. Able to provide training and supervision to others.
10. Flexible and able to manage stress.

Surgeons (including Obstetrics & Gynaecology)

1. MBBS/MBBCh degree
2. Full registration with the General Medical Council with a licence to practice
3. Membership of the Royal College of Surgeons (MRCS)
4. ST4 level of training or above*
5. To be able to operate independently without supervision
6. Prior medical experience in delivering high quality care to patients in developing nations
7. Available within 2 weeks of request to respond, for deployments of 2-4 weeks' duration.
8. Willingness to work in unstable, insecure areas.
9. Able to provide training and supervision to others.
10. Flexible and able to manage stress.

*Note – if you would like to volunteer in a medical capacity and not undertake surgery the requirements of medical doctor apply instead.

Nurses/Midwives

1. Bachelor's degree or nursing diploma
2. Full registration with the Nursing and Midwifery Council
3. Minimum of 2 years' hospital based experience post-qualification
4. Prior medical experience in delivering high quality care to patients in developing nations
5. Available within 2 weeks of request to respond, for deployments of 2-4 weeks' duration.
6. Willingness to work in unstable, insecure areas.
7. Able to provide training and supervision to others.

8. Flexible and able to manage stress.

Paramedics

1. State registered
2. Min. 2 years' experience post-qualification
3. Prior medical experience in delivering high quality care to patients in developing nations
4. Available within 2 weeks of request to respond, for deployments of 2-4 weeks' duration.
5. Willingness to work in unstable, insecure areas.
6. Able to provide training and supervision to others.
