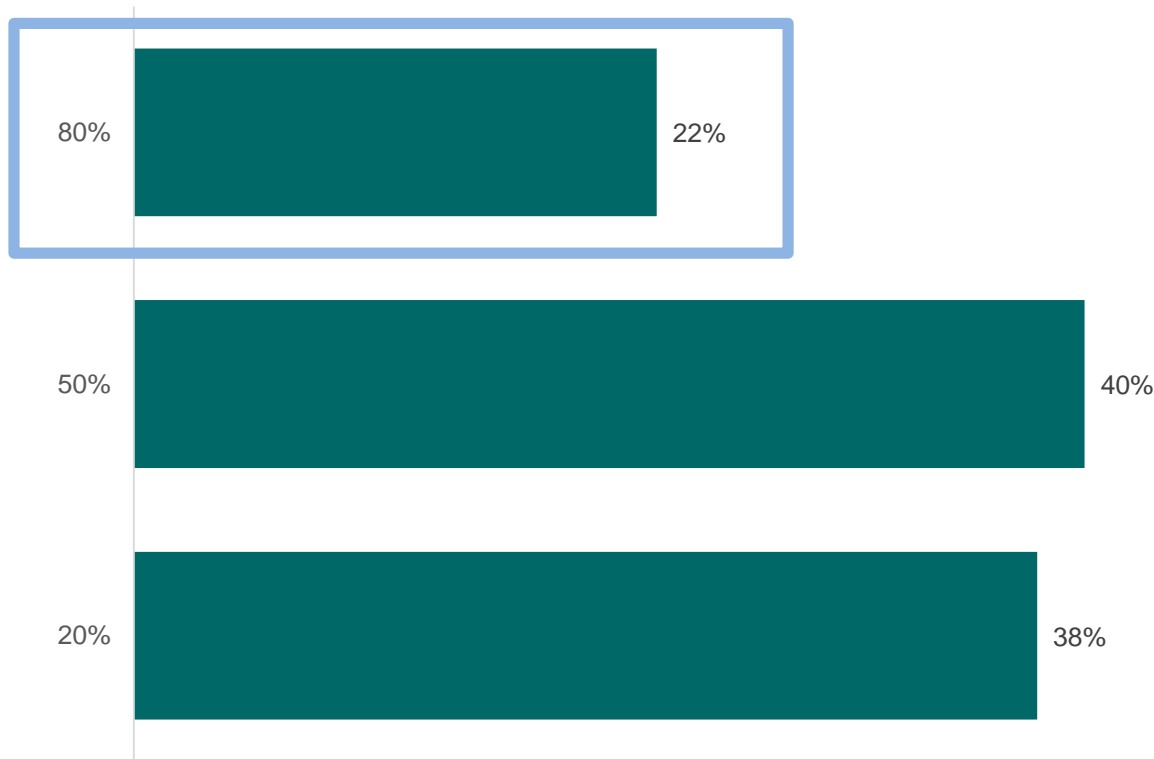
In the last 20 years the proportion of people living in extreme poverty, worldwide, has...?

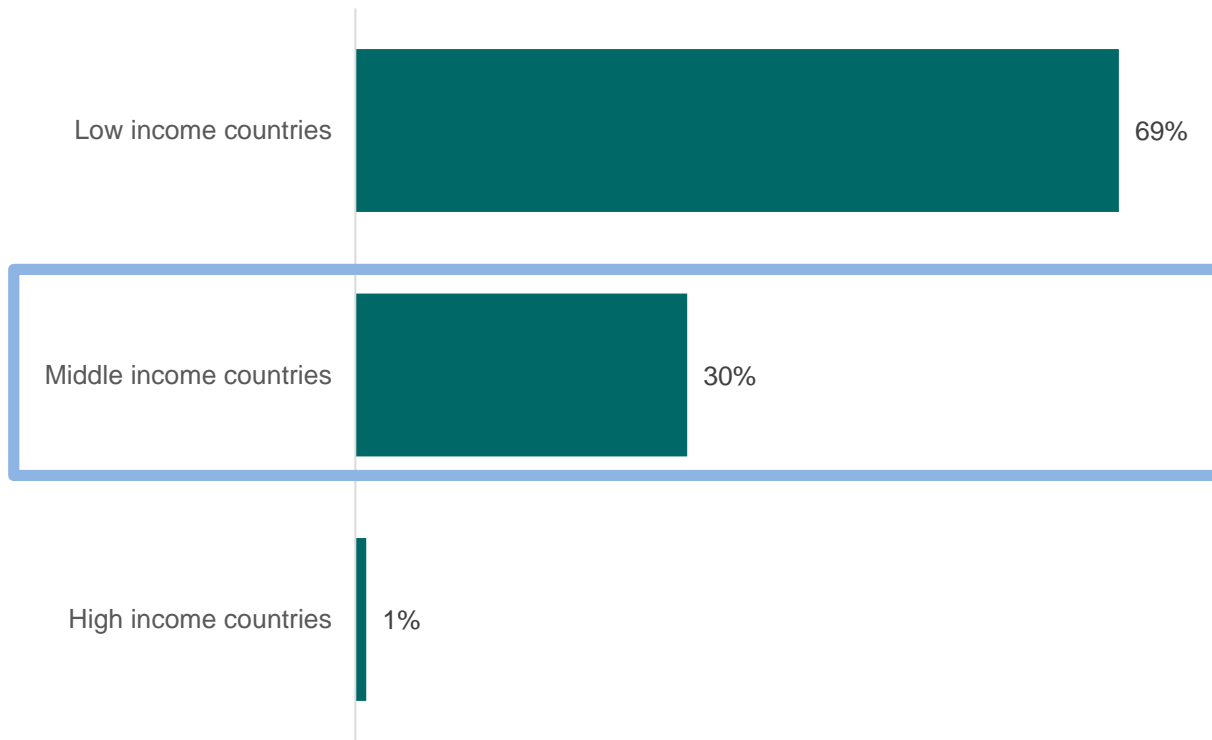
How did the number of deaths per year from natural disasters change over the last hundred years?

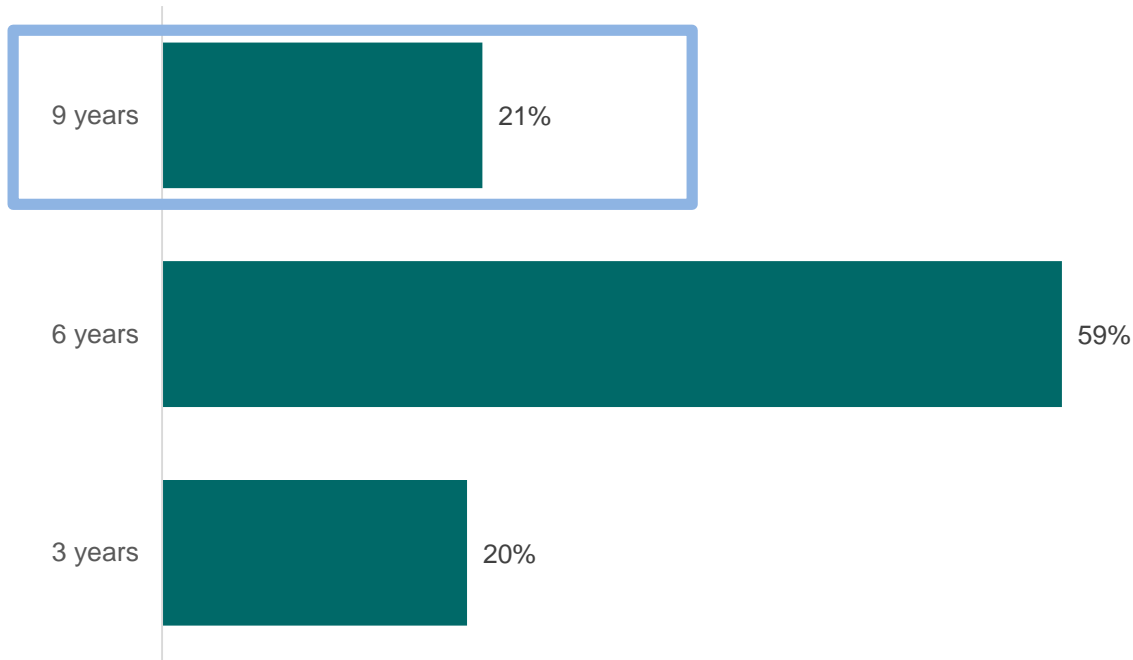

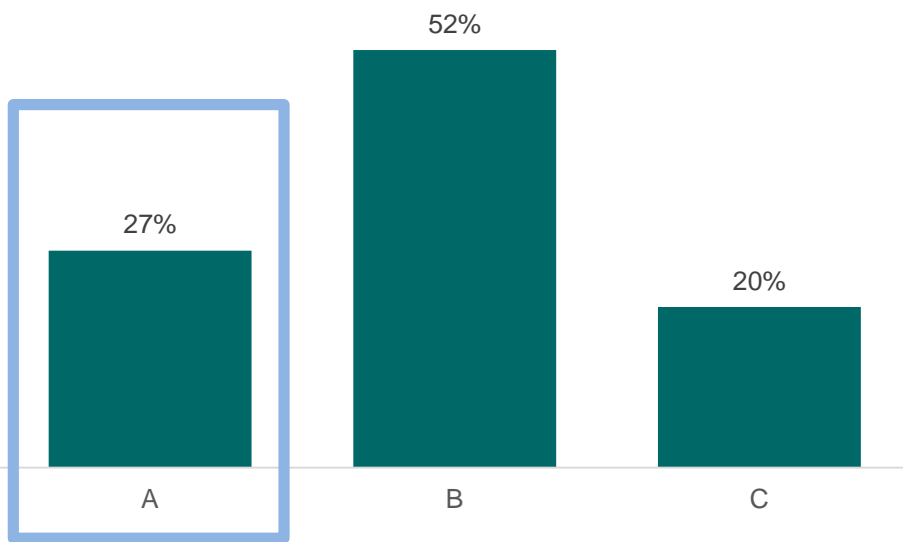
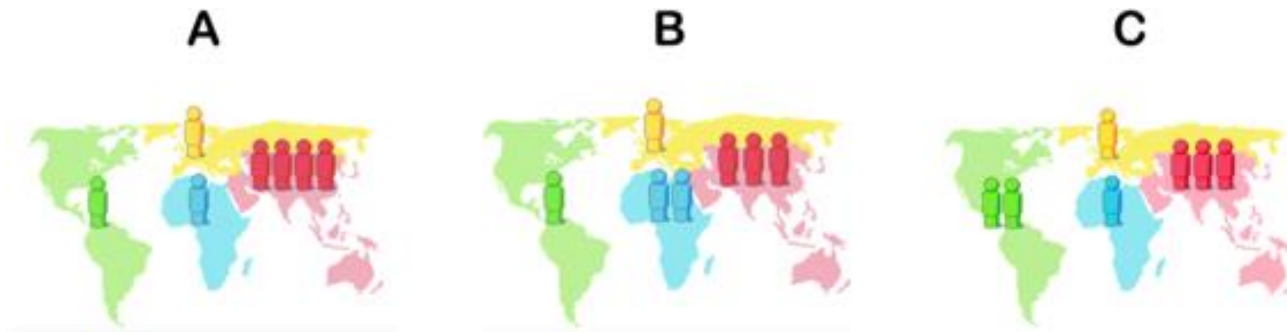

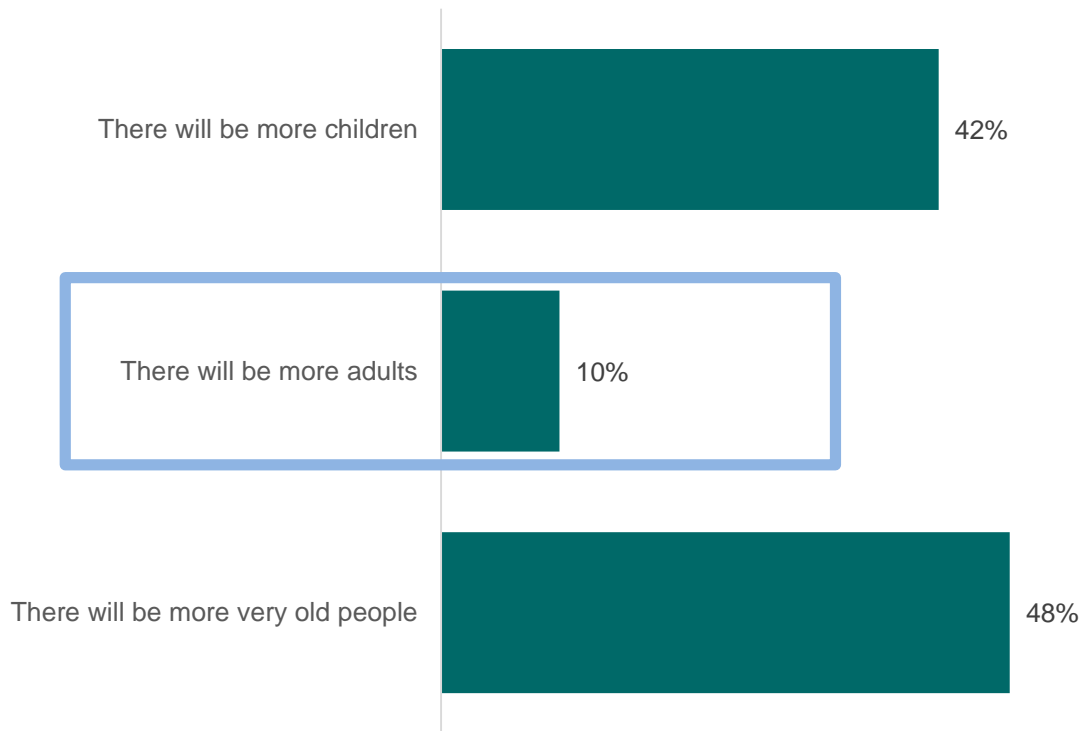
**There are roughly seven billion people in the world today. Which map shows where people live?

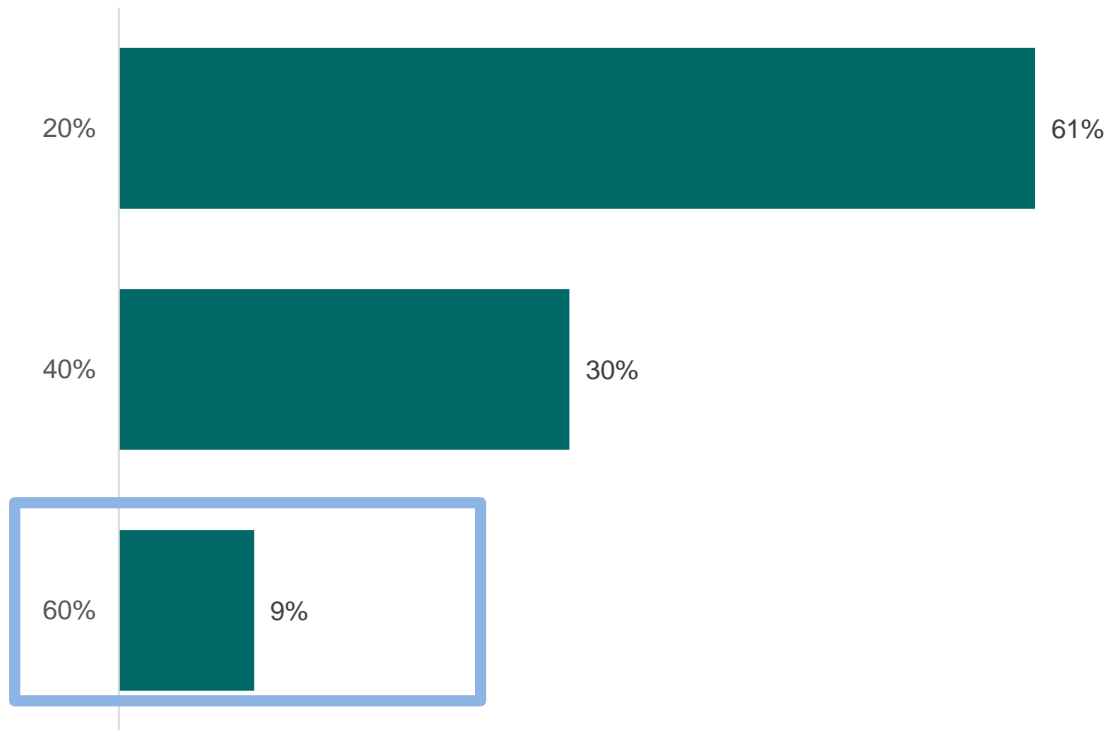

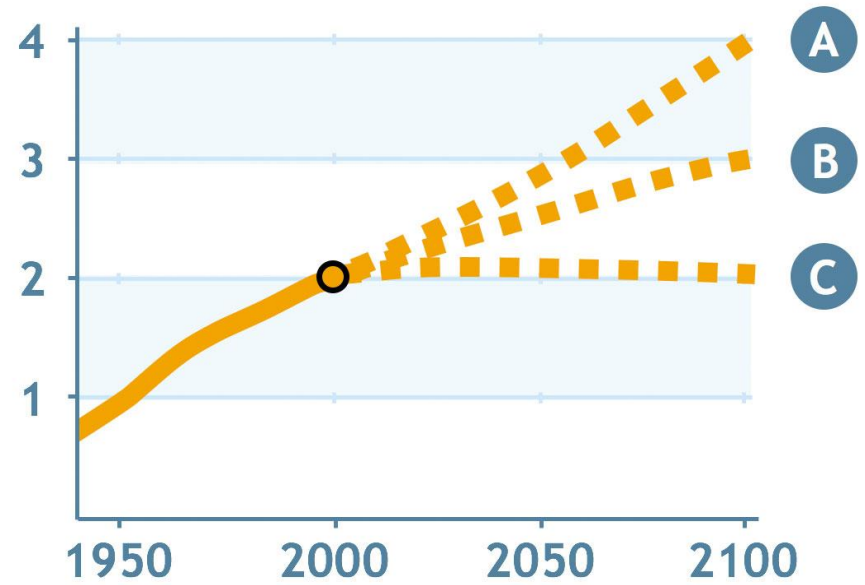
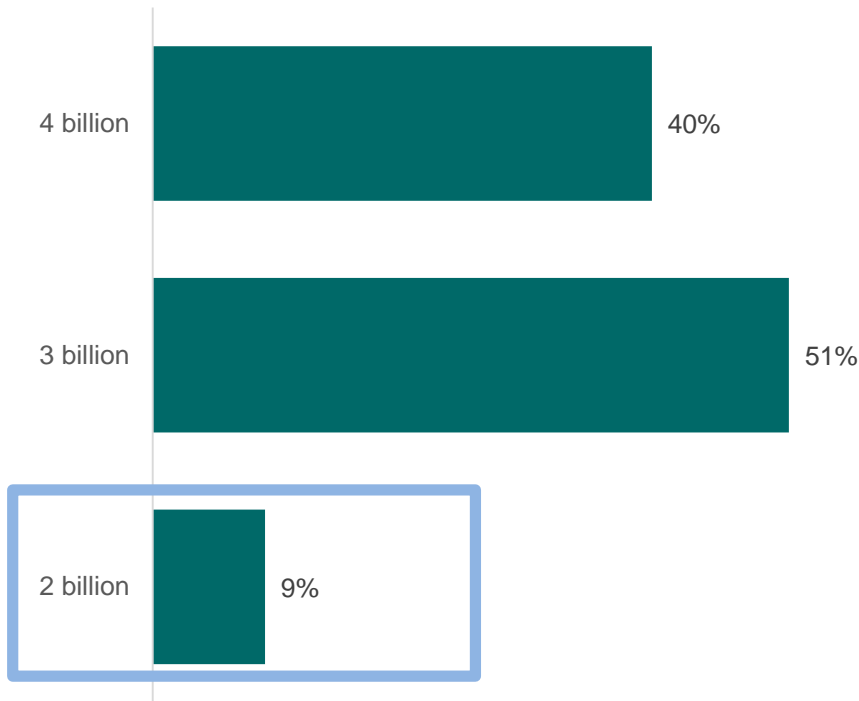
In all low income countries across the world, how many girls finish primary school?

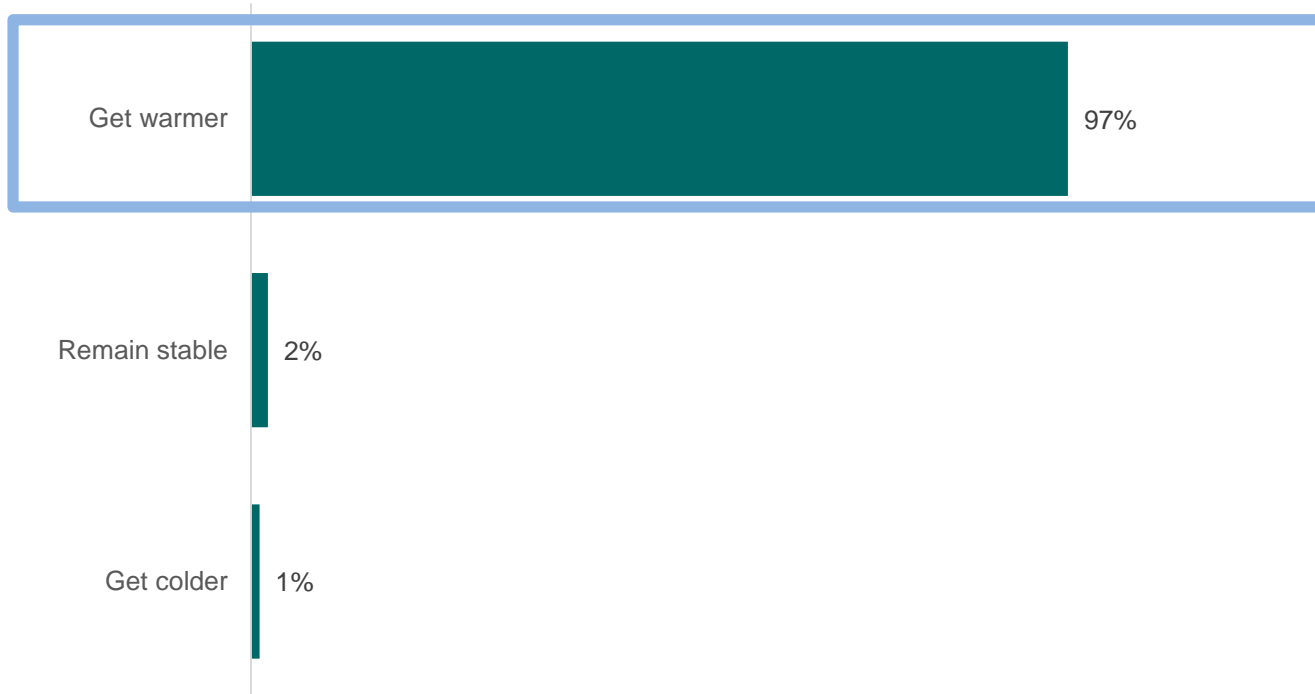

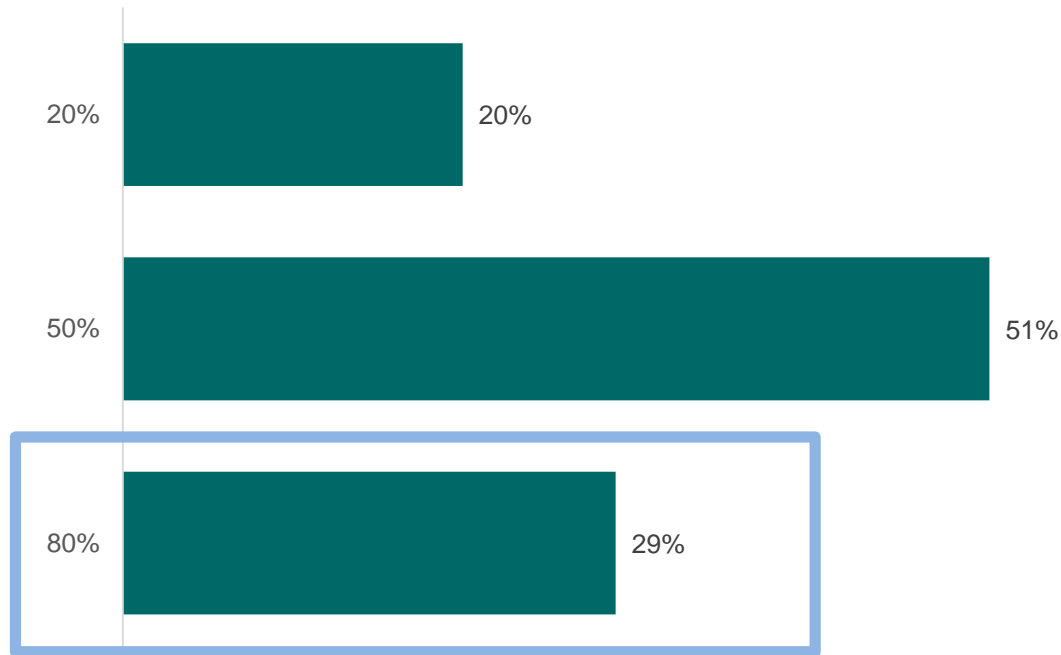

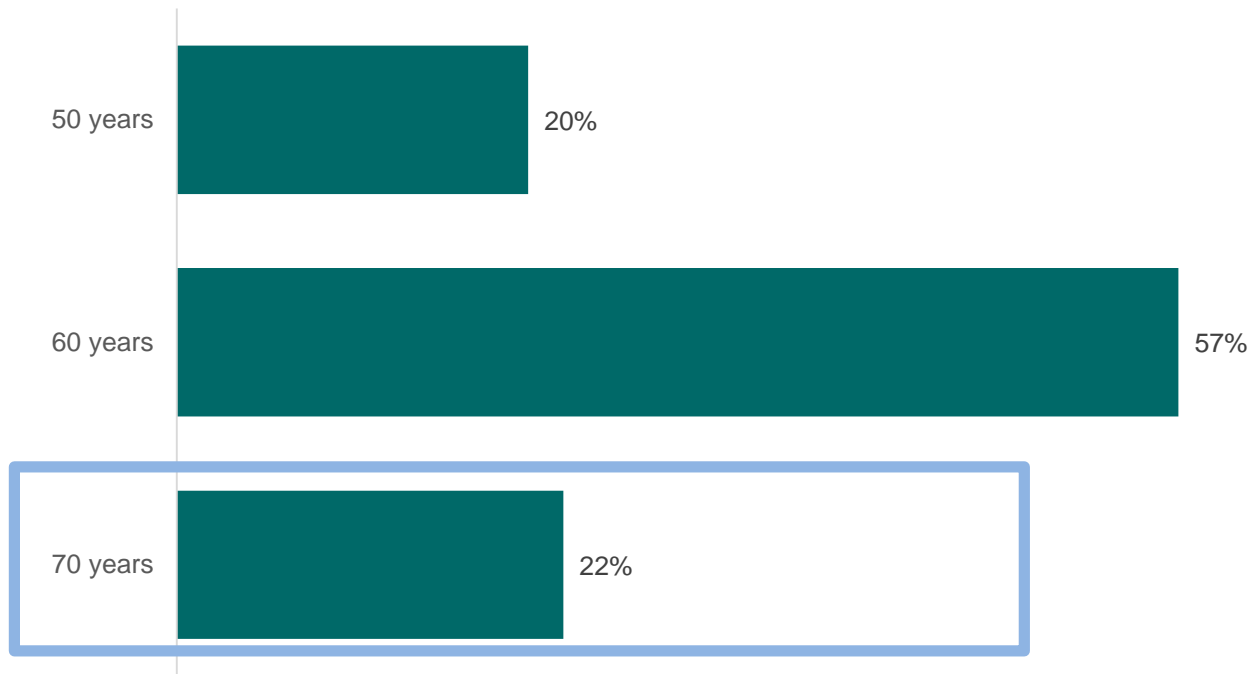

Background

Target group/Implementation

The target group was the Swedish public aged 18-79. The survey was conducted with a nationally representative sample in Novus web panel, Sverigepanelen.

Number of interviews: 1023.

Response rate: 54%

Field period: March 17-23 2017.
