

How many of the world's 1-year-old children today have been vaccinated against some diseases?



How did the number of deaths per year from natural disasters change over the last hundred years?










In all low income countries across the world, how many girls finish primary school?






The global climate experts believe that over the next 100 years the average temperature will:



The target group was the Swedish public aged 18-79. The survey was conducted with a nationally representative sample in Novus web panel, Sverigepanelen.

Number of interviews: 1023.

Response rate: 54%

Field period: March 17-23 2017.
