Aims of the IC/HH WIKI

- to develop an e-learning platform for trainers in IC/HH;
- to store, share, exchange and optimise the knowledge on IC/HH in a collaborative way amongst European Countries;
- to make it easily accessible to IC/HH professionals (to all interested professionals).

Who are the authors?

IC/HH experts who voluntary candidate themselves to develop one or more IC/HH topics in one or more pages, taking into account the provided Taxonomy.

Who are the reviewers?

IC/HH experts who voluntary candidate themselves to peer review one or more IC/HH topics in one or more pages in agreement with the authors.

Who constitutes editorial board?

In this phase, the editorial board is coordinated by Silvio Brusafferro and constituted by:

Editing process

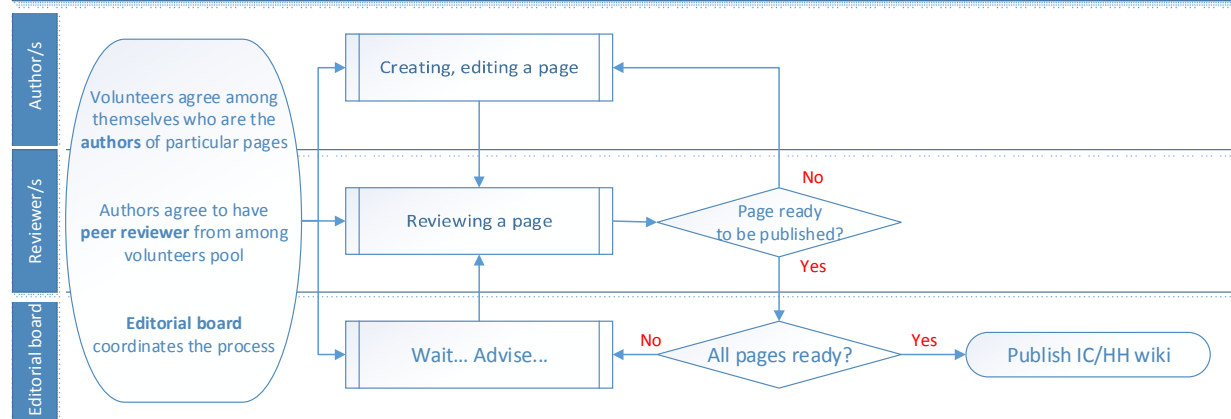
The editorial board will ensure:

- scientific queries are addressed or stated as areas of continued debate;
- consistency of the structure of articles;
- linguistic correctness;
- appropriate cross linkage with other articles in "IC/HH WIKI" where needed.

All submitted text will be:

1. Revised by the reviewers and editorial board;
2. Made available for all the IC/HH WIKI community.

Editorial rules

Each topic should be developed in one or two pages.

Each page should have:

- Title;
- Name of the lead and other authors and institution;
- Description of the content:
 - two or three paragraphs;
 - the terms/concepts that need a better definition should be underlined and described in another page;
 - the terms/concepts related to others that already exist should be underlined and cross referenced;
- Link to available documentation;

- Up to three references.

The content of the IC/HH pages could include written pages (a text) and/or appropriate figures, schemes, pictures.

Additional training materials: slides and paper

For each topic you are welcome to provide around 3 slides that summarize the essential contents developed in the IC/HH WIKI pages.

The slides related to IC/HH WIKI topic should have:

- A title related to the IC/HH WIKI topic;
- The main contents;
- Name/s of the author/s and the institution/s, together with their logo/s at the bottom of every slide.

Rules on copyright

Author will be mentioned as a first contributor of the IC/HH pages. Training materials could be used by all interested, following the creative commons **Attribution-Non Commercial-Share Alike 3.0 Un ported (CC BY-NC-SA 3.0)**.

The original author is not necessarily expected to review or to endorse modifications.

A Reader should be free:

- to share – to copy, distribute and transmit the work;
- to remix – to adapt the work.

Under the following conditions:

attribution – You must attribute the work in the manner specified by the author or licensor but not:

- in any way that suggests that they endorse you or your use of the work;
- In any way that suggests you are author of the work.
