



Interfaith Fortnight 14th – 25th November

Interfaith fortnight aims to promote understanding between people of different faiths. We are excited to be able to welcome representatives from 6 world faiths into school on Thursday 17th November to talk to children about what prayer means to them. Prayer is an important part of all faiths. We hope the event will help children to see both similarities and differences between theirs and other's people's faiths. Each year group has also been asked to do some additional learning about one faith in particular. As part of their learning, they will visit a place of worship from the faith they are studying. Each class will also be making things to represent how different people pray to hang on a prayer tree in school. During interfaith fortnight, please do take the opportunity to share your own experiences of prayer and ask your child to tell you about what they have found out about prayer in another faith to your own.




How many times do they flash together during a whole minute?
