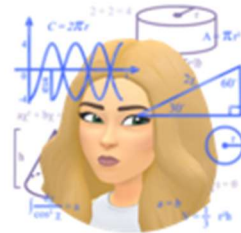
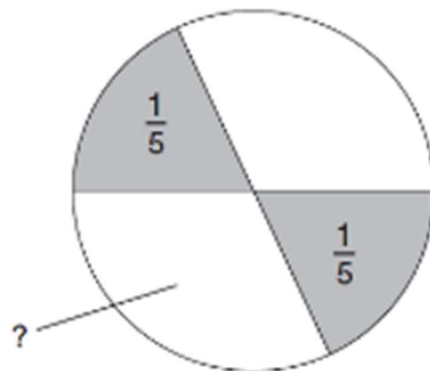

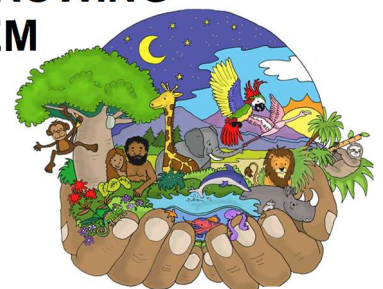

## A Culture of Safeguarding at St Catherine's Gates and Doors

Every morning, the bell goes at 8:45am, and the classroom doors are closed. After this time, children are late and will not be able to enter school through their classroom door. This is because:

- Dinner orders have been completed;
- Attendance registers have been submitted.

Children who have not been marked as Present are therefore unaccounted for – if they are let into the classroom after the bell, they will not have been marked as Present on the register, and dinner will not have been ordered for them.

Children who are not in the classroom by 8:45am have to enter through the school office so that their dinner order can be taken on a list, and their arrival is also listed. Office staff then use this list to update the registers and the dinner orders, ensuring that all children are accounted for.

Sometimes, children are sent through the gate by their parent (or other adult) as the bell is ringing – these children will be locked out of their classroom – PLEASE don't let it happen to your child as they may be bewildered and upset.

We have one member of staff who closes the gates in the morning, they cannot close all 4 gates at the same time, and so this is what will happen from now on:

- Year 5/6 gate will be closed first at 8:40;
- Year 3/4 gate will be closed next;
- Year 1/2 (Roe Lane) will then be closed just before 8:45;
- Reception gate will be closed last and a member of staff will be there to remind adults that the bell is about to ring and the children will not get to their classroom in time, they will direct them to the school office.
- Anyone still on the yard at 8:45 will need to exit through the Reception gate on Firshill Crescent.

The reason we do this is NOT to upset adults and children – it is to make sure that all of the children are safely accounted for.

If your child travels to school alone, please make sure that they understand this information, and that they know what to do if they arrive late school after the gates have closed. We will be reminding them in Assembly, and would be grateful if you can reinforce the message at home.

**Next week, due to building work, the Year 5/6 gate will be closed. Children will need to use one of the other gates, and parents will need to collect their child at a different place, please make sure your child knows the plan and what to do if they are worried.**

## “School Wars”

I am writing to make you aware of a social media trend that has recently been circulating on platforms such as TikTok and Snapchat, sometimes referred to online as “School Wars.” These posts attempt to encourage rivalries between local schools and promote anti-social behaviour.

We are sharing this information simply to keep our community informed and to raise awareness of online activity that could potentially affect young people.

Some of these posts attempt to create artificial rivalries between schools, sometimes using themes such as “Red vs Blue” or “North vs South.” In some cases, they encourage students to gain “points” for negative or harmful behaviour or suggest filming incidents for social media attention. While much of this content is often designed simply to generate online attention, we take the safety and wellbeing of our pupils very seriously.

We are grateful to the pupils who have already shared their observations with us. By staying vigilant, these pupils have provided helpful insights that allow us to stay well-informed. This type of proactive communication is invaluable; it ensures we can address external trends early and keep our school environment focused on learning rather than online distractions.

Schools are also working closely with their local policing teams to monitor these trends. While much of this activity often amounts to online content designed to create alarm, the safety and wellbeing of our pupils remains our absolute priority. We want to ensure our young people understand that what may seem like a “joke” or “banter” online can have very real legal and physical consequences.

As a Catholic school community, we encourage our pupils to treat others with dignity, respect and kindness both online and offline. We would therefore be grateful if parents and carers could support us by speaking with their children about responsible and respectful online behaviour.

Over the coming weeks, it may be helpful to:

- Monitor online activity and the platforms your child is using.
- Be aware of group chats or messages they may be receiving.
- Talk openly with your child about what they may have seen online and encourage them not to share or engage with harmful content.

If you do see anything concerning, please share it with us. If there is an immediate risk to safety, please contact the police via 101 or 999 as appropriate.

Please be assured that the safety and wellbeing of our pupils remains our highest priority. By working together as a school community, we can continue to ensure that St Catherine's Catholic Primary School remains a safe, respectful and supportive environment for all.

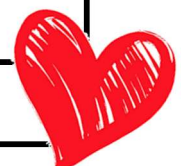

# Monthly Science Fun!

Check out March's experiment:

## Dancing Raisins!

### You will need:

- Raisins
- Fizzy water
- Still / Tap water
- Two clear plastic cups



Fizzy water is actually very good at keeping your body hydrated!



- Step 1: First, carefully pour some still water into a clear plastic cup.
- Step 2: Gently, drop a raisin into the water. Did it float or sink?
- Step 3: Next, pour some fizzy water into a different clear plastic cup.
- Step 4: Gently, drop a raisin in the fizzy water. Did it float or sink?



Raisins were actually discovered by accident! History reveals that the first raisins were discovered back in 2000 BCE, when grapes were accidentally left to dry in the sun!

In the still water, the raisin sinks because the raisin is denser than the water. In the fizzy water cup, the raisin is again denser than the water. However: the bubbles get trapped in the grooves of the raisin, helping it to float back to the surface. When the bubbles pop, the raisin sinks back down.

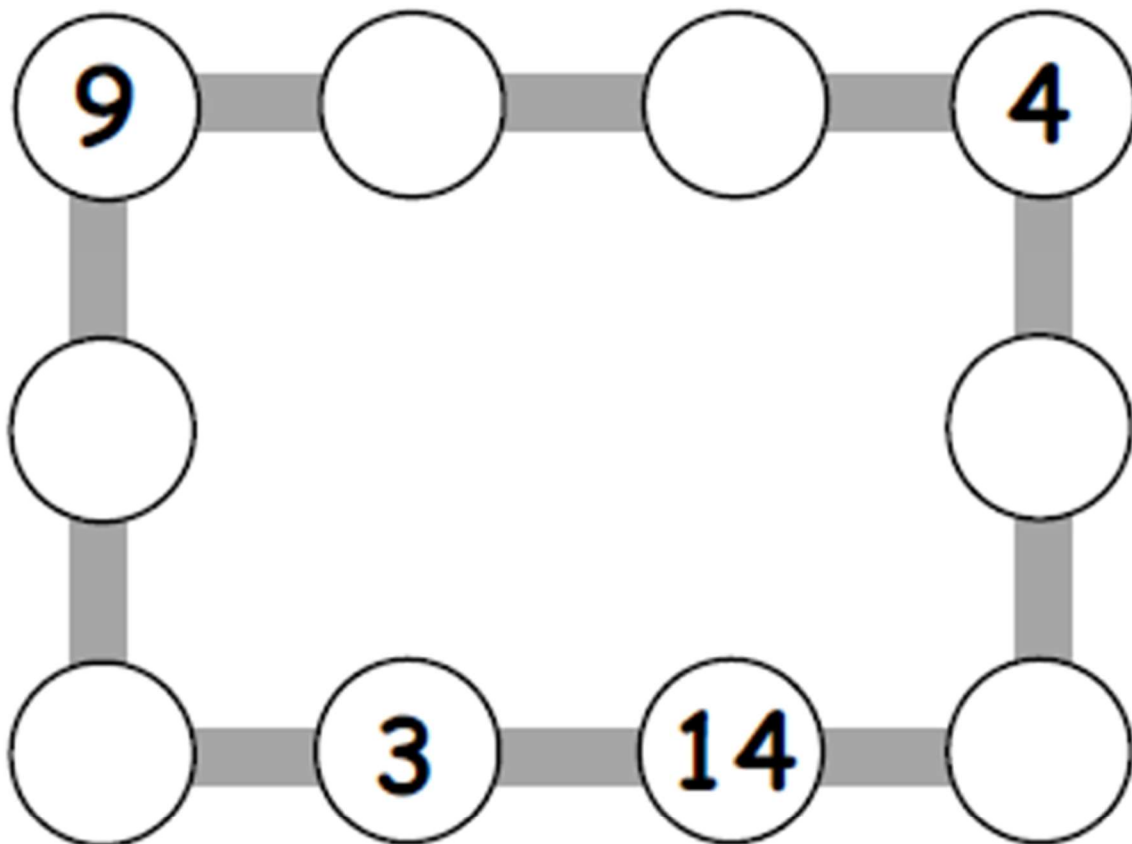

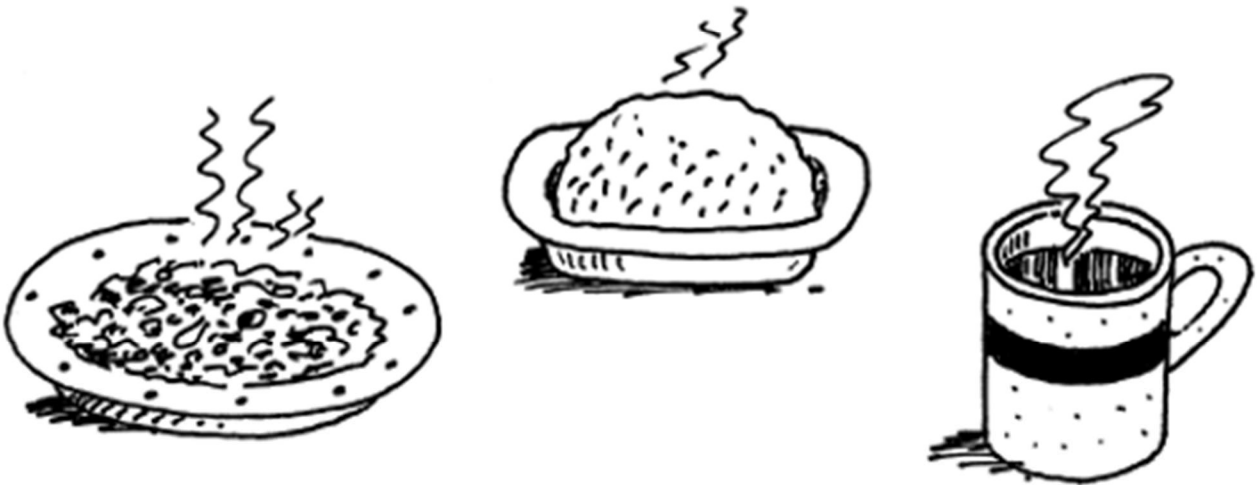
