What Is Creating Routes & Who Is It For?

Creating Routes is back for 2026!

Creating Routes is a FREE practical training programme for Global Majority* theatre makers aged 18+ and creatives who want to use their creative skills in community settings (e.g. working with groups in schools, community organisations, health settings, criminal justice etc).

With over a decade of proven success, we provide an alternative route into entering the sector that strikes a balance between the practical and the theoretical. Creating Routes trainees get the opportunity to develop the knowledge, skills and experience needed to gain employment in the Participatory Arts sector.

About the Programme

Creating Routes is a FREE evening facilitator training programme for people from the Global Majority aged 18+. We actively welcome applicants who identify as LGBTQ+, Disabled and people living in the borough Greenwich. This programme is a collaboration between Emergency Exit Arts (EEA) Talawa Theatre Company and Goldsmiths University of London – as a collective we have come together to help diversify the participatory arts sector with artists from different cultural backgrounds.



Course Structure



- We are currently recruiting for the Spring Term 2026. This year there will be two pathways for the Spring Term, a standalone course 'Your Unique Facilitation Style' for up to 12 people that runs alongside a strand taking place at Goldsmiths University for 5 of the 12 participants. People wishing to attend the Goldsmiths university pathway must also attend the 'Your Unique Facilitation Style' sessions.
- 'Your Unique Facilitation Style' course is a series of eight sessions that explores and develops your unique facilitation style and lays foundations for working as a professional facilitator in community settings. We are accepting 12 applicants in total for this 5 of which will also attend Goldsmiths.

Who Are We Looking For?

This programme is open to Global Majority theatre-makers and creatives aged 18+. If this is you and you are interested in applying, please make sure you meet the criteria below.

Essential Criteria:

- Committed to a career in participatory arts facilitation
- Skilled and experienced in performance/theatremaking (in any role; as a writer, performer, designer etc.)
- Passionate about using theatre and other art forms with young people and/or adults in community settings
- Willing to work and learn collaboratively (with peers and professionals)
- Excellent verbal communication skills
- Ability to work to high professional standards, i.e. punctual, organised and self-motivated
- Be committed and able to attend ALL of the designated dates

Desirable Criteria:

- Some experience of working in participatory arts
- Knowledge of other art forms or experience of working cross art-form

Those wishing to apply for a place on the 'Reflexive Practitioner' module on the Goldsmiths Applied Theatre MA alongside 'Your Unique Facilitation Style' MUST be available for all dates on both pathways. We will be taking 5 applicants of the total 12 participants for this pathway. The dates for the Goldsmiths sessions are as follows:

The 5 participants attending both pathways will undertake paid professional work placements with EEA, Talawa and other companies who work in community settings. There will also be mentoring sessions, to be arranged with you!
