Monday	<p>Let's talk about time! "Orders and sequences familiar events" Have a chat with your adult about the different things you do during the day – when do you do them? In what order do you do them? What do you do first? What do you do last?</p>  <p>Draw a picture of something you do at each point of the day on the sheet on the blog. CHALLENGE: Can you write a sentence about what you do?</p>	<p>Read one of your books on Bug Club or one of your favourite books or magazines to an adult.</p> <p>AND</p> <p>Listen to a story read by one of your adults OR a story online, e.g. Oxford Owls, CBeebies Bedtime stories.</p> <p>OR</p> <p>Practise some of your high frequency or tricky words (Practical ideas on the class blog)</p>	<p>Amazing Grace! This week we are going to think about how we should treat everyone equally and with respect! Can you watch this story (Or read it if you have a copy of it!)</p>  <p>Have a chat with your adults about the importance of being able to do anything you want regardless of the colour of your skin, your gender, your religion, what you believe or where you come from. Why is this important in relation to the way we treat others?</p>	<p>Barbara Hepworth First up is Barbara Hepworth... She is a famous female artist who created abstract sculptures. Can you watch the PowerPoint about Barbara Hepworth and then have a go at making your own sculpture of you or your family? You could use any material you like!</p> 
Tuesday	<p>Measuring time in simple ways Talk with your adult about the different ways we measure and tell the time. What have you got in your house that helps you measure and tell time? (Clocks, stop watch, sand timer, phones, computers etc)</p>  <p>Have a go at some of the challenges uploaded on the blog!</p>	<p>OR</p> <p>Practise some of your high frequency or tricky words (Practical ideas on the class blog)</p>	<p>How does Grace feel when her classmates tell her she can't be Peter Pan? Watch or read the story again and then talk with your adults about how it made Grace feel. Why did it make her feel this way? How would you feel if someone told you this? Can you write a sentence to describe how Grace feels?</p>	<p>Andy Warhol Today we're going to learn about a famous Pop Artist called Andy Warhol! Watch the PowerPoint and video and then have a go at creating your own piece of Pop Art!</p> 
Wednesday	<p>Day or Night? Can you cut out the pictures (or draw if you don't have a printer) and put them in the right column based on whether you do them in the morning, middle of the day or at night time?</p> 	<p>Practise some of your high frequency or tricky words (Practical ideas on the class blog)</p>	<p>What do you like to do? Grace likes to pretend to be lots of different characters! Can you choose one of the pictures and write a sentence about it? Can you draw a picture of someone you like to pretend to be and write a sentence?</p>	<p>Michelle Reader Have a look at the work of sculpture artist Michelle Reader – she creates things out of recycled materials! Watch the PowerPoint and video and then have a go at creating your own 'rubbish monster'!</p> 
Thursday	<p>Making Salt Dough With your adults help, can you measure out the right amount of each ingredient and mix together to make your salt dough? Then use it to make your art in today's wider curriculum lesson!</p> 	<p>Don't forget you've also got your 'Teach Your Monsters to Read' to have a go at.</p>	<p>It's nearly Father's Day! Can you draw a picture of your dad or someone special in your life - it could be your Grandad, an uncle, your brother or a cousin! Could you write a sentence about why that person is special to you? What do they do that makes them special? What do they like to do? What is their favourite food? Do they make you laugh, how?</p>	<p>Lorien Stern Today, have a look at the work of Lorien Stern! She lives in America and makes ceramic art based on things that she is afraid of – but she turns them in to things that aren't scary! Using the salt dough you made earlier, could you make a model of something that you are scared of but then make it less scary?</p> 
Friday	<p>Fun Fridays! We've spent the week learning about some different artists and you have become artists yourselves! Have a look on The Tate Website and choose one of the activities to have a go at – there are loads of things to do and make on there! You could even make your own art gallery to display all of the art you have created this week and previously – could you make tickets for your family to enter your gallery, descriptions to describe your pieces of art or a shop to buy souvenirs? Lucky Dip – If your child is stuck with what to play, pick something out of a bag or a hat to do!</p>
