Very positively so far. I think people like the aesthetic, the reclaimed wood and the green roofs, so I think so far it's been received well.

Yeah, so we got to know the neighbours quite a bit. And it's good to see more than one in just road, I think it does change the vibe of the street and brings a lot of life
