

## **WATERING STREET TREES**

## © CET INVOLVED

- Young and newly planted trees need regular watering to survive during their first few years. All trees planted by Trees for Cities are watered by our team April – Oct.
- Council-planted trees may be watered too but ALL trees will benefit from extra watering.



- Trees line many of the UK's streets. Have a look at the street where you live.
- The trees that need water the most are young trees, but all trees will benefit from water.



On the roadside, you should be careful of:

- Traffic and reversing and parking vehicles
- Needles (avoid trees if you see needles)
- Contact with soil (best to avoid)
- Low hanging branches
- Exposure to harsh weather
- Contact with tree accessories (tree cages could have sharp edges)
- Manual handling
- Contact with the tree (be careful of thorns).

## **WATER!**

Use the irrigation pipe if there is one, as this will ensure the water reaches the roots.





- No irrigation pipe? Pour water slowly onto the roots of the tree, near the trunk. If it starts to puddle, allow water to soak in, before pouring more.
- If it is dry and hot, water as much as you can, perhaps every day or every week.
- Any amount of water is going to be a bonus! If a litre bottle is all you have to hand, that is great.
