The mission of *Continuity in Education* (CiE) is to improve the quality of education and the developmental outcomes for children and young people with medical or mental health needs, across the globe. The journal operates at the level of teachers and other frontline stakeholders, with the following aims:

- To publish articles based on the theory, research and practice of educating and supporting young people who are dealing with illness and other events, which may disrupt their social, emotional, psychological and/or educational development.
- To support the sharing of best practice, ideas and activities among hospital teachers.
- To encourage the publication of academic articles by hospital teachers, educators and other professionals, thus raising their metacognitive and reflective capabilities in relation to their own practice in the field.

The fully open access format of the journal, supported by the four organizations, results in all articles made freely available worldwide immediately upon publication.
