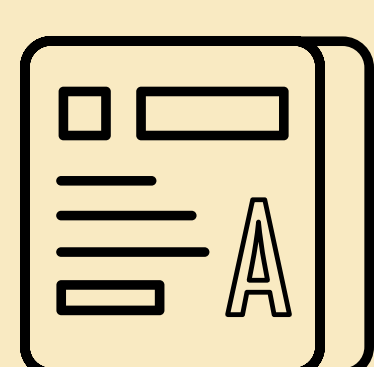




Annual Report Overview 2019/20

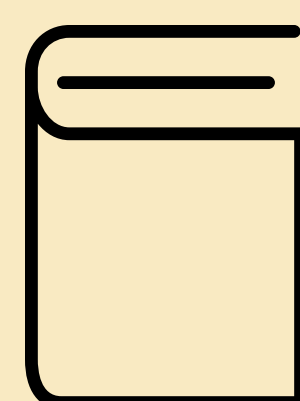

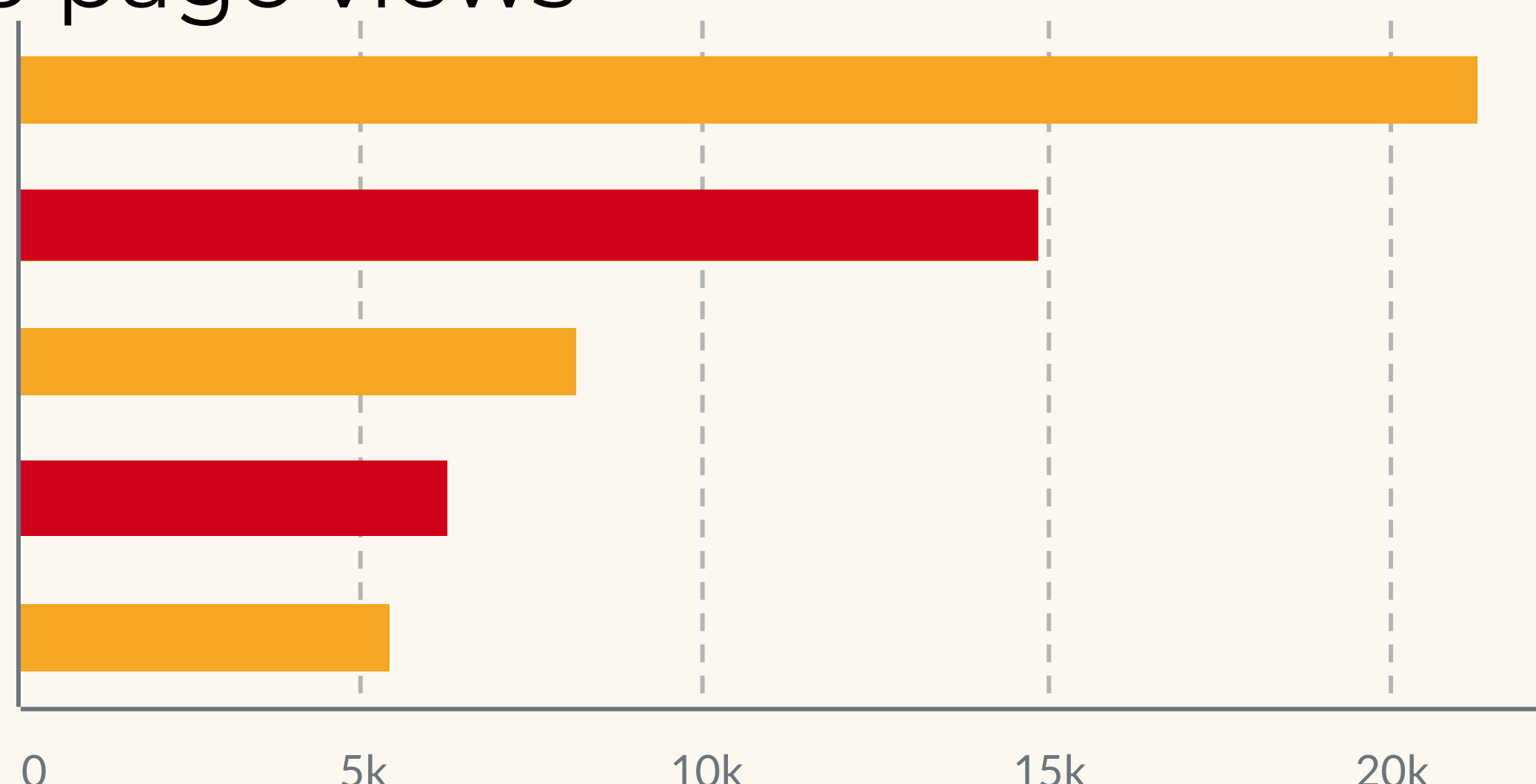
Monograph Page views

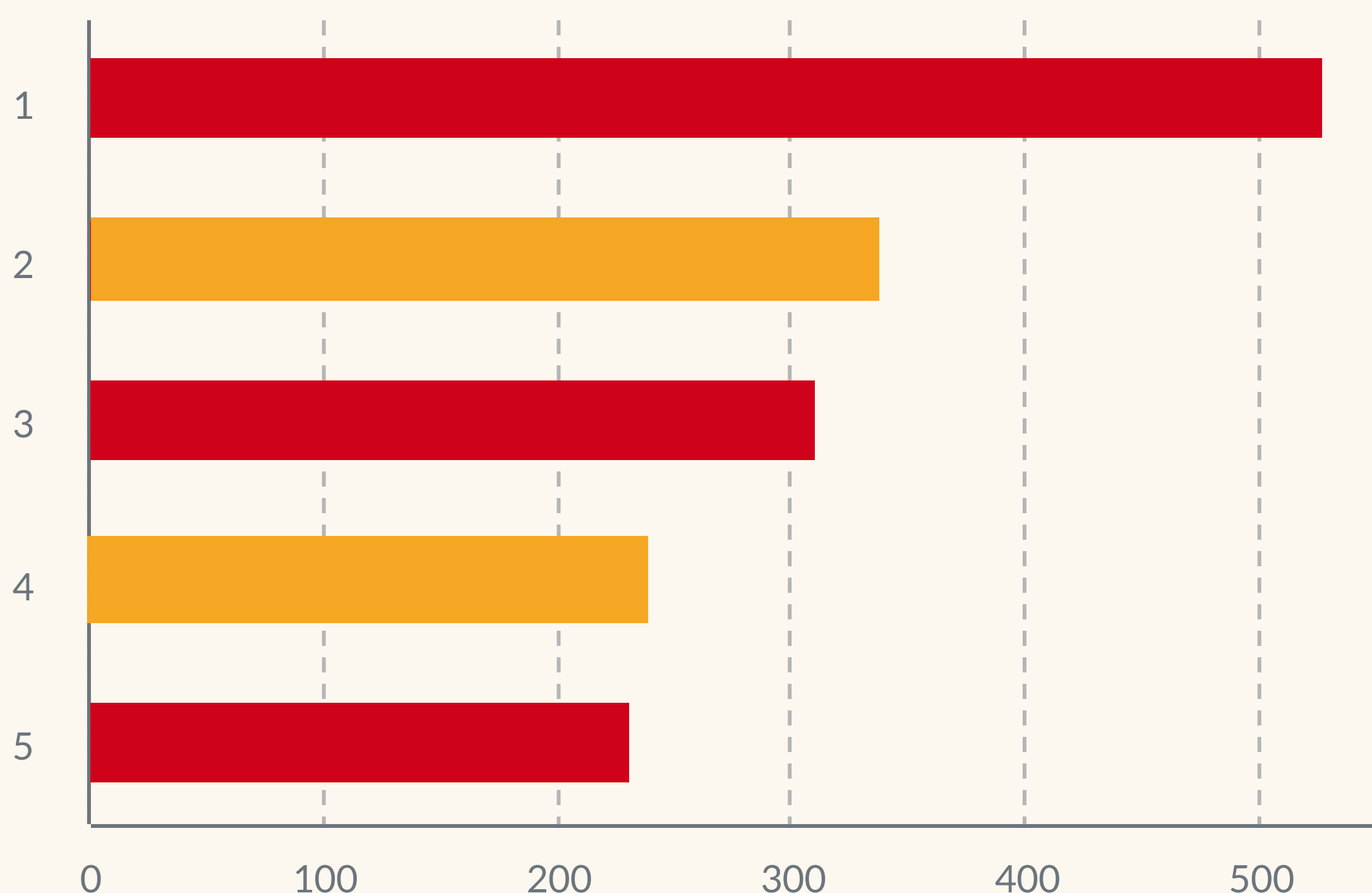

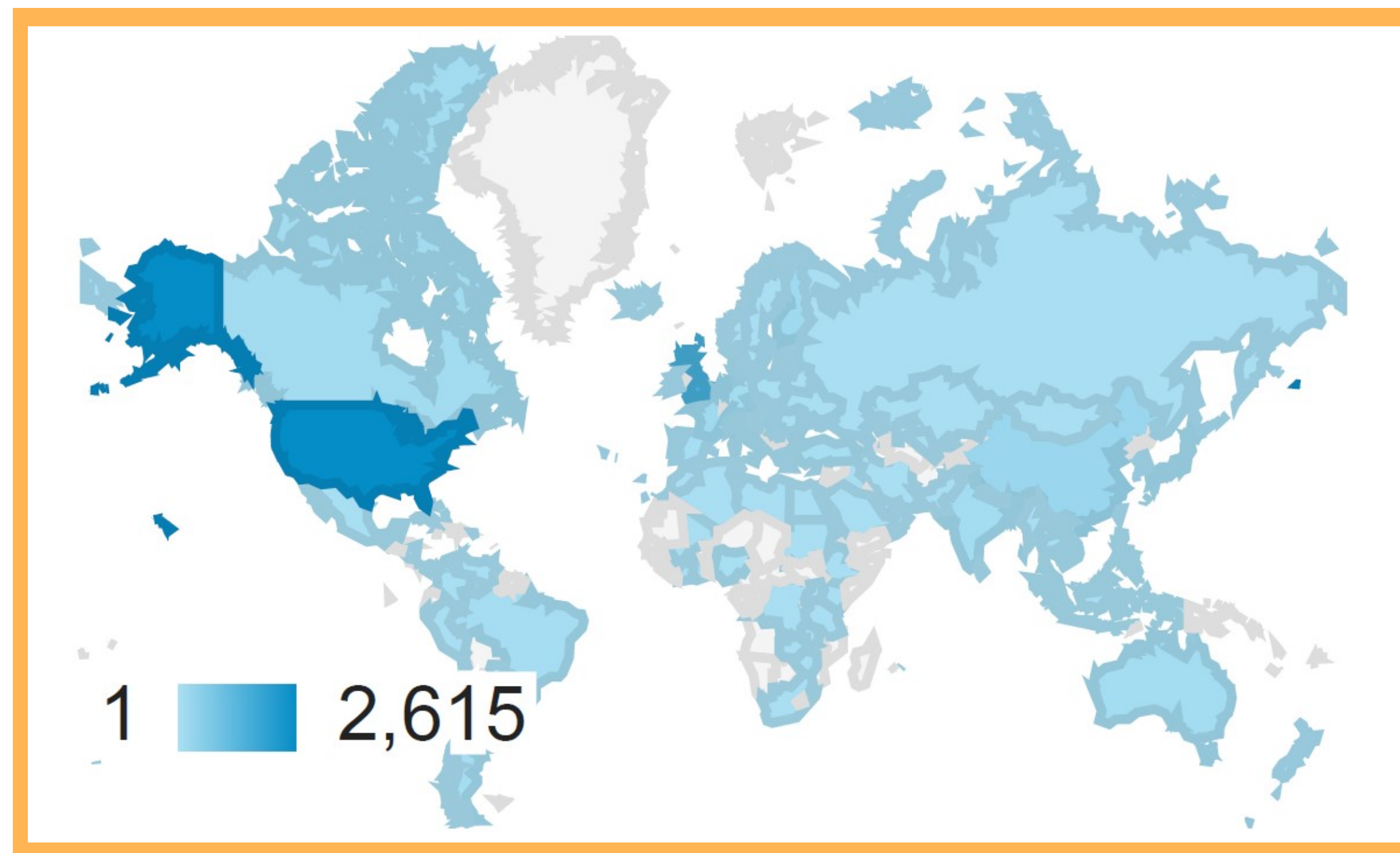

International engagement

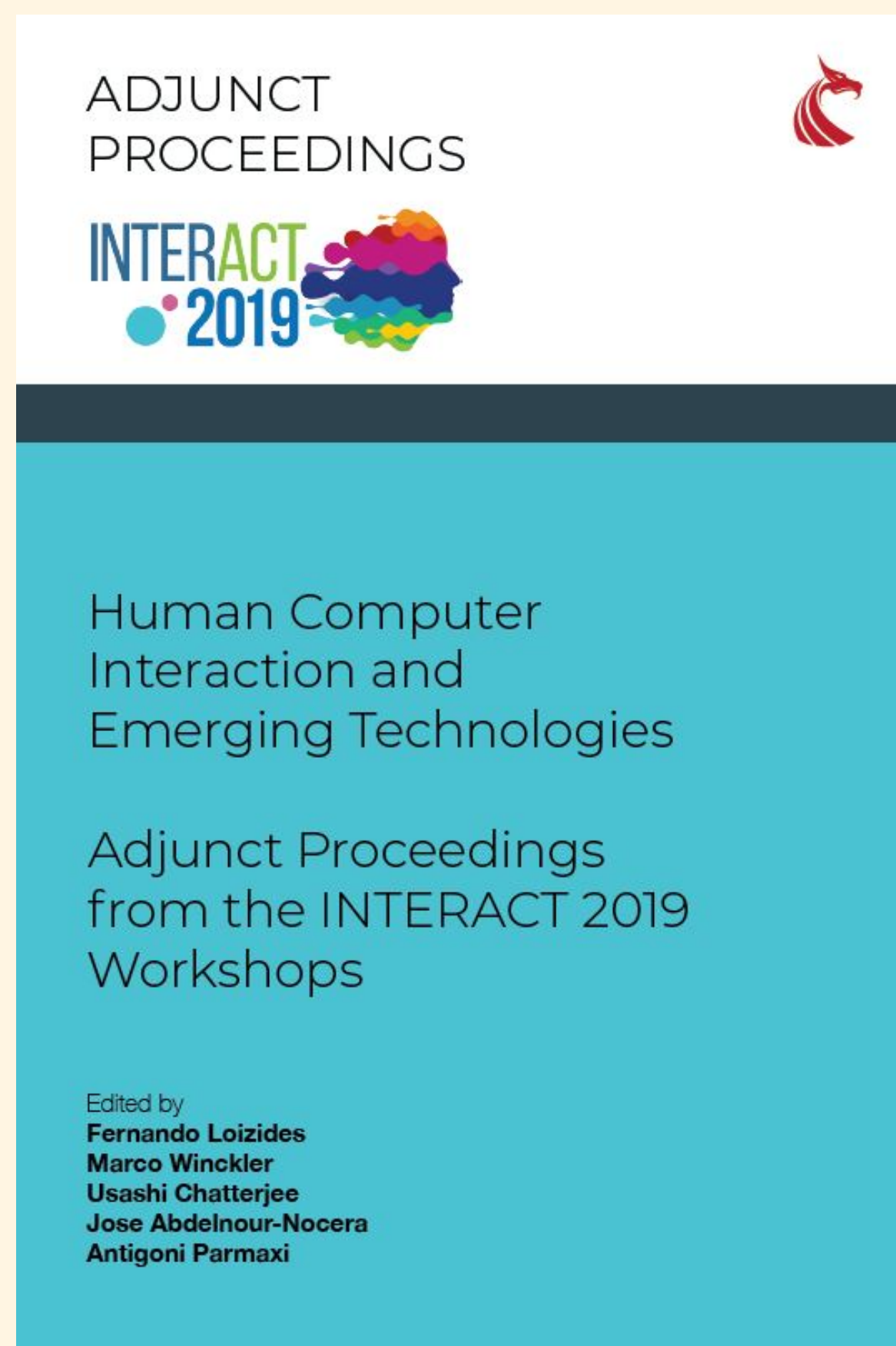
This map shows the international popularity of the Press, with visitors to its website from 111 countries on six continents during 2019/2020 – four more countries than in the previous academic year. The 2,615 US visitors to the site make up 40% of the total number for the year, surpassing the 1,568 UK visitors who represent 24%.



Third Press monograph published

This is the first volume of conference proceedings to be published by Cardiff University Press. It is edited by Fernando Loizides, Marco Winckler, Usashi Chatterjee, Jose Abdelnour-Nocera and Antigoni Parmaxi, and was published in May 2020.

INTERACT Conferences are an important platform for researchers and practitioners in the field of human-computer interaction to showcase their work. This volume contains the Adjunct Proceedings to the 17th INTERACT Conference (2019), which were submitted after the main publication deadline and published after the conference. They consist of a series of selected papers from workshops, the Student Design Consortium and the Doctoral Consortium.



Monograph Publication Programme: new developments

During 2019/20 the Press Monograph Commissioning Panel has:

Established a flexible publication process for submissions of conference proceedings

Revised recommended monograph wordcounts, to include shorter submissions

Published guidance on the submission of monographs based on theses

Amended peer reviewer guidelines to allow internal reviewers where appropriate

Approved the listing of Press monographs on the Google Books and Google Play apps

Launched the Press Monograph Award scheme for Cardiff University authors
