Important points

- You will also be required to pass the Professional Skills tests in literacy and numeracy before starting the programme.
- Personal suitability for teaching is important and is assessed at interview.
- During registration on the programme, you will be required to complete a Disclosure and Barring Service (DBS) barred list and criminal records check and a Disqualification by Association form.
- There are twenty eight weeks of assessed school based training spread over the three years of the degree.
- All teaching placements must be successfully completed for the award of Qualified Teacher Status (QTS) to be made.
- Attendance is required at all scheduled sessions.
- Accreditation – Qualified Teacher Status

Academic Year

Academic Year 2018 - 2019

The University's academic year is made up of 3 Semesters. For most undergraduate/postgraduate students the academic year is split into two Semesters (A & B). Each of these is made up of teaching weeks followed by exams (the re-sit period falls within Semester C).

- Semester A runs from Monday 17 September 2018 to Friday 11 January 2019
- Semester B runs from Monday 14 January 2019 to Friday 17 May 2019
- Semester C runs from Monday 20 May 2019 to Friday 13 September 2019

Expected workload

In the UK, a full time student is expected to spend 1200 hours on their studies each year. Please find below an estimate of how your time will be spent on this course during each year of study.

*There are School Placements in each year of the course of the following length: Year 1 = 9 weeks, Year 2 = 9 weeks and Year 3 = 10 weeks. These are full time and students are expected in school Monday to Friday. In addition, students will also visit a Special School and are expected to spend time preparing lesson plans, completing relevant placement paperwork and on developing subject knowledge. Students will not be teaching full time during every placement but will have an increasing amount of teaching as the course progresses.
