Important points

Music Production students are creative technologists, wanting to produce their own music, enhanced by the very best sound production values. Students devise and work on a range of musical projects centred around music creation and production, to develop and hone skills and understanding of a range of musical styles, musical theories and cultural contexts, as well as working with others to develop and realise an overall music 'production' vision.

Students are required to attend all scheduled classes and tutorials, as outlined on their timetables.

Academic Year

Academic Year 2018 - 2019

The University's academic year is made up of 3 Semesters. For most undergraduate/postgraduate students the academic year is split into two Semesters (A & B). Each of these is made up of teaching weeks followed by exams (the re-sit period falls within Semester C).

- Semester A runs from Monday 17th September 2018 to Friday 11th January 2019
- Semester B runs from Monday 14th January 2019 to Friday 17th May 2019
- Semester C runs from Monday 20th May 2019 to Friday 13th September 2019

The above schedule includes two "Independent School Study Weeks": 5th – 9th November 2018, and 11th – 15th March and a University Study Week 14th – 18th January 2019.
