Important points

- This course is accredited by the Institute of Physics and upon graduation you will be eligible to join the Institute as a graduate member.
- An optional placement year or study abroad year or a combination of the two may be available after Year 2 for students who achieve a 2:1 grade average in Year 2 and are considered capable of coping with a year away from their studies.
- Transfer to our MPhys Integrated Masters degree is possible at any stage of your programme provided you have obtained a 2:1 degree average.
- Transfer to the BSc (Hons) Physics with Science Education route may be possible during your second year of study. Upon successful completion of the course you will be recommended for Qualified Teacher Status. You will undertake several sessions of schoolbased training, each over a period extending to July. An attendance rate of 100% is required for school-based training.
- An attendance rate of 75% at all scheduled learning and teaching sessions is a requirement of this programme.
- Students may be required to undertake a Disclosure and Barring Service check for some modules.

Academic Year

Academic Year 2018 - 2019

The University's academic year is made up of 3 Semesters. For most undergraduate/postgraduate students the academic year is split into two Semesters (A & B). Each of these is made up of teaching weeks followed by exams (the re-sit period falls within Semester C)

- Semester A runs from Monday 17 September 2018 to Friday 11 January 2019
- Semester B runs from Monday 14 January 2019 to Friday 17 May 2019
- Semester C runs from Monday 20 May 2019 Friday 13 September 2019
