Important points

Full-time and part-time students are taught together on two- or three-day short courses, which are followed by tutorials and assignments in the following 8-10 weeks. Part-time students do not have to attend tutorials. This model of delivery ensures that study can be combined with full-time employment.

Students may enrol for a Semester A or Semester B start, on a full-time or part-time basis.

All MSc students will carry out a Sustainable Planning Dissertation that will take the form of a report containing individual research into a spatial planning problem.

The MSc in Sustainable Planning programme gives students the skills they need in order to meet contemporary sustainability challenges in planning. The course offers students opportunities to gain valuable skills that make them highly employable, and allows them to contribute to a much needed and fast changing professional area. The course provides graduates with excellent career opportunities in planning, environmental management, urban design, community development, regeneration, transport management, climate change mitigation and other planning related careers.

Academic Year 2018-19

The academic year is split into three Semesters (A,B & C). Teaching on the MSc Sustainable Planning programme runs through Semester A, Semester B and Semester C. (The re-sit period falls within Semester C).

- Semester A runs from Monday 17 September 2018 to Friday 11 January 2019
- Semester B runs from Monday 14 January 2019 to Friday 17 May 2019
- Semester C runs from Monday 20 May 2019 to Friday 13 September 2019

Additional expenses
