Important points

- We offer a flexible LLM structure and a range of up to eighteen different taught modules (subject to viable student numbers) and there are normally eight named pathways, which you can opt to study: LLM in Business Law, LLM in International Commercial Law, LLM in Governance, Risk Management and Compliance, LLM in IT Law and Policy, LLM in Intellectual Property and Data Protection Law, LLM in International Law, LLM in International Financial Law, LLM in International Human Rights Law.
- If you choose to study a named pathway then you will study two compulsory modules (one each semester) as well as two options (one each semester). There is also the option to study for a Joint Pathway, (where you study the two compulsory modules from the two similar named pathways) to give you four modules of study. Alternatively, you can study for a general LLM in Law, which allows you a choice of four modules so that you can study areas of law of particular interest to you.
- In Semester C you will complete your Dissertation, which must relate to a compulsory module within the pathway of your choice.
- You can commence your studies in either September (Semester A) or January (Semester B) of each year.

Academic Year

Academic Year 2018 - 2019

The University's academic year is made up of 3 Semesters. For Semester A entrant postgraduate students the academic year is split into three Semesters (A, B & C). Each of these is made up of ten teaching weeks, (the re-sit period falls within Semester C).

- Semester A runs from Monday 23 September 2019 to Friday 17 January 2020
- Semester B runs from Monday 20 January 2020 to Friday 22 May 2020
- Semester C runs from Monday 25 May 2020 – Friday 18 September 2020
