Important points

The programme is accredited by BCS, the Chartered Institute for IT on behalf of the Engineering Council for the purpose of fully meeting the academic requirement for registration as a Chartered Engineer (for 1st year entrants only).

In order to progress to Year 2 (Level 5), students will need to pass 120 credits at Year 1 (Level 4), with a pass in the Programming module.

You may transfer to and from our BSc and MEng programmes up to the beginning of Year 3 (Level 6). In order to continue onto the Meng programme you will need to have passed all modules and obtained a 2:1 degree average.

From time to time the School may offer short courses in appropriate and relevant subject areas, which normally would be subject to recruiting a minimum of 20 students for the course.

Academic Year

Academic Year 2019 – 2020

The University's academic year is made up of 3 Semesters. For most undergraduate/postgraduate students the academic year is split into two Semesters (A & B). Each of these is made up of teaching weeks followed by exams (the re-sit period falls within Semester C)

- Semester A runs from Monday 23 September 2019 to Friday 17 January 2020
- Semester B runs from Monday 20 January 2020 to Friday 22 May 2020
- Semester C runs from Monday 25 May 2020 – Friday 18 September 2020

Expected workload

In the UK, a full time student is expected to spend 1200 hours on their studies each year. Please find below an estimate of how your time will be spent on this course during each year of study.

The term “coursework” includes written assignments, short projects, laboratory work and in-class tests.

Additional expenses

The University does not charge fees during your placement year but you may incur additional costs i.e. travel and accommodation. The exact value of these costs will depend on where your placement is located.

There may be a tuition fee charge for a study abroad year. Further details are available in the attached ‘Fees and Finance’ policy.

Undergraduate study requires extensive reading and access to reference works. Recommended texts are available in the Learning Resources Centre either as ebooks or printed material. Please note that availability of printed material is limited so students may wish or be required to purchase their own copies. The average cost of a recommended text is approximately £50 - £100. We currently estimate that the cost of expenditure on mandatory textbooks is between £200 and £400 per year, dependent on the pattern of modules students choose to study.

During your time with us there may be an opportunity to participate in 1 or 2 field trips. Depending on the trips available, the approximate cost for each trip is between £15 to £30.

As part of your final year project you may choose to purchase hardware or software.

During your studies you may have the option to take short courses. The cost of a short course is approximately £300 - £350.
