### **Important points**

- This course receives accreditation from the Health and Care Professions Council (HCPC).
- You will be undertaking three practice placements consisting of a total of 28 weeks over three years.
- You will be subject to Enhanced Disclosure and Barring Service (DBS) checks and Occupational Health (OH) Screening.
- Non-disclosure of any criminal activity prior to or during your studies may lead to you being withdrawn from your programme, as outlined in the School of Life and Medical Sciences' Disclosure and Barring Service Procedure;
- OH Screening will assess your ability to meet the programme requirements as set out in accordance with the Professional Statutory and Regulatory Bodies (or equivalent bodies).
   OH clearance will be required prior to attendance on placement (or other specified activity).
   If for any reason you should fail to get OH clearance this will prevent you from meeting the programme requirements and may lead to you being withdrawn from your programme.

#### **Academic Year**

#### Academic Year 2020 - 2021

The University's academic year is made up of 3 Semesters. Normally most undergraduate programmes use Semesters A and B, additionally postgraduate programmes and specific undergraduate programmes use Semester C. Each of these is made up of teaching weeks followed by exams (the re-sit period falls within Semester C).

The academic year will vary each year due to placements. It is not possible to provide the exact terms dates across the three years as these have not been set by the university. However for the academic year 2020-21 at level 4 the term dates are as follows

- Term 1 Monday 21 September 2020 to Friday 18<sup>th</sup> December 2020
- Term 2 Monday 11<sup>th</sup> January 2021 to Friday 26<sup>th</sup> March 2021
- Term 3 Monday 12th April 2021 to Friday 11th of June 2021

The resit period is during the weeks commencing the 21st and 28th of June 2021.

Please note that in your final year (year 3) the academic year will run for 12 months from the last week in September until the 3<sup>rd</sup> week of September the following year.

## **Expected workload**

On this programme a full time Dietetics student is expected to spend a minimum of 4356 hours on their academic studies and a minimum of 1041 hours on placement across the three years. This means that a Dietetics student will be expected to study for a minimum of 1412 hours in the first year, 1530 hours in the second year and 1414 hours in the third year. Please find below an estimate of how your time will be spent on this course during each year of study.
