Live Sound and Lighting Technology students are those students who wish to focus through the lens of broadcast and live event reinforcement. Practical techniques are developed within a range of different spaces to suit differing audiences. Students also engage with the latest light-projection mapping systems as well as designing and specifying venue-based audio systems.

Students are required to attend all scheduled classes and tutorials, as outlined on their timetables.

Academic Year

Academic Year 2020 – 2021

The University's academic year is made up of 3 Semesters. Normally most undergraduate programmes use Semesters A and B, additionally postgraduate programmes and specific undergraduate programmes use Semester C. Each of these is made up of teaching weeks followed by exams (the re-sit period falls within Semester C).

- Semester A runs from Monday 21 September 2020 to Friday 15 January 2021
- Semester B runs from Monday 18 January 2021 to Friday 21 May 2021
- Semester C runs from Monday 24 May 2021 to Friday 17 September 2021
