### Important points

The BA Honours Business Studies programme provides students with the opportunity to study across a range of business disciplines, establishing a firm grounding to pursue a wide variety of careers in business. The programme places a major emphasis on employability skills, and the flexibility of option choices allows students to select modules to match their skills and interests. It achieves this through a blend of academic study, intercultural awareness and employability and enterprise skills development. The Business 'with' pathway aims to give students an opportunity to combine their study of business with more specialist related topics.

The Business Studies and Business Studies 'with' pathways are designed to allow flexibility with students able to switch out of a 'with' pathway into the Business Studies pathway at L5 and L6.

### Academic Year

#### Academic Year 2021 – 2022

The University's academic year is made up of 3 Semesters. Normally most undergraduate programmes use Semesters A and B, additionally postgraduate programmes and specific undergraduate programmes use Semester C. Each of these is made up of teaching weeks followed by exams (the re-sit period falls within Semester C).

- Semester A runs from Monday 27 September 2021 to Friday 21 January 2022
- Semester B runs from Monday 24 January 2022 to Friday 13 May 2022
- Semester C runs from Monday 16 May 2022 to Friday 09 September 2022
