These programmes offer a suite of modules that meets the ongoing professional development of qualified healthcare professionals working in a range of UK healthcare settings. The programmes incorporate a range theoretical and practical knowledge, understanding and skills that reflect the contemporary demands and challenges of nursing practice. These modular programmes are suitable for nurses from all fields of nursing and harnesses the themes of service improvement, needs led care, clinical knowledge, skills and leadership development. The structure of the programmes are designed to facilitate access to standalone modules as well as the more traditional route to Bachelor's level study. Studying the programme will enable students to develop into knowledgeable and adaptive practitioners with a strong capacity for critical thinking, and will encompass the need to anticipate and prepare for new roles and responsibilities.

Academic Year

Academic Year 2021 – 2022

The University's academic year is made up of 3 Semesters. Normally most undergraduate programmes use Semesters A and B, additionally postgraduate programmes and specific undergraduate programmes use Semester C. Each of these is made up of teaching weeks followed by exams (the re-sit period falls within Semester C).

- Semester A runs from Monday 27 September 2021 to Friday 21 January 2022
- Semester B runs from Monday 24 January 2022 to Friday 13 May 2022
- Semester C runs from Monday 16 May 2022 to Friday 09 September 2022
