Important points

- The Sports Studies with Psychology degree programme provides a solid foundation in the subject areas of sport and psychology, proving an attractively balanced and stimulating programme of study. Modules consider local, social, developmental and global perspectives related to these subject disciplines, bringing together two diverse areas in one programme and supporting progression into future career pathways.
- You will study 60 credits in each subject discipline in the first year (level 4), and 90 credits of sport related modules, and 30 credits of psychology modules at levels 5 and 6 of the degree programme.
- The programme currently offers a range of module options at levels 5 and 6, providing the opportunity for you to tailor your degree to your own interests. Your option choices will depend upon meeting any specified prerequisites and will be offered subject to student demand and timetabling constraints.
- On successful progression to level 6, you have the option to include a Year Abroad or Sandwich Placement within your programme.
- The modules studied within this programme will engage students with expertise from industry, and vocational elements, promoting employability and strengthening career prospects.
- Some sport and psychology modules or extra-curricular activities may require enhanced Disclosure and Barring service clearance.

Academic Year

Academic Year 2021 - 2022

The University's academic year is made up of 3 Semesters. For most undergraduate students the academic year is split into two Semesters (A & B). Each of these is made up of teaching weeks followed by exams (the re-sit period falls within Semester C)

- Semester A runs from Monday 27 September 2021 to Friday 21 January 2022
- Semester B runs from Monday 24 January 2022 to Friday 13 May 2022
- Semester C runs from Monday 16 May 2022 to Friday 09 September 2022
