### Important points

## Academic Year 2020 – 2021

The University's academic year is made up of 3 Semesters. Each of these is made up of teaching weeks followed by exams or equivalent assessments.

- Semester A runs from Monday 27 September 2021 to Friday 21 January 2022
- Semester B runs from Monday 24 January 2022 to Friday 13 May 2022
- Semester C runs from Monday 16 May 2022 to Friday 09 September 2022

This course is taught in Semesters A and B only, though some assessments may take place during Semester C.
