Important points

- We offer a flexible LLM structure and a range of up to fifteen different taught modules (subject to viable student numbers) and there are normally seven named pathways, which you can opt to study: LLM in Business Law, LLM in International Commercial Law, LLM in Governance, Risk Management and Compliance, LLM in Intellectual Property and Data Protection Law, LLM in International Law, LLM in International Financial Law and LLM in International Human Rights Law.
- If you choose to study a named pathway then you will study two compulsory modules (one each semester) as well as two options (one each semester). Alternatively, you can study for a general LLM in Law, which allows you a choice of four modules so that you can study areas of law of particular interest to you.
- In Semester C you will complete either the Dissertation or the Clinical Legal Education and Research module, which is available on the following pathways: LLM Business Law, LLM International Commercial Law, LLM Intellectual Property and Data Protection Law and the general LLM in Law. The dissertation/mini dissertation topic for both 60 credit modules will need to focus on either of the compulsory modules within the relevant pathway award title.
- You can commence your studies in either September (Semester A) or January (Semester B) of each year.

Academic Year

Academic Year 2021 - 2022

The University's academic year is made up of 3 Semesters. For Semester B entrant postgraduate students, the academic year is split into three Semesters (B, C & A). Semesters B & A are made up of ten teaching weeks.

- Semester B runs from Monday 24 January 2022 to Friday 13 May 2022
- Semester C runs from Monday 16 May 2022 to Friday 09 September 2022
- Semester A runs from September 2022 - January 2023 (dates to confirmed)
