### Important points

The Contemporary Nursing programme meets the needs of graduate nurses in the fast-changing world of health service provision across a range of roles and settings. The Contemporary Nursing programme is for qualified nurses wishing to differentiate themselves from their peers in an increasingly competitive professional careers market. This programme enables nurses to undertake a range of clinical and professional modules that reflect their current Continuing Professional Development needs. The MSc Contemporary Nursing modules will further develop knowledge and skills in clinical, leadership, teaching & learning, research and management and promote the integration and application of evidence base practice.

Entry to the Return to Practice module is dependent on an enhanced DBS check and occupational health clearance. There is a £500 bursary awarded to each returner by Health Education England in order to cover any costs incurred whilst undertaking this module. Uniform is supplied by the University for your placements.

### Academic Year

The programme is offered in a part-time mode, and leads to one of the following awards:

MSc Contemporary Nursing (180 credits) (normally 2-5 years)

PgDip Contemporary Nursing (120 credits) or PgCert Contemporary Nursing (60 credits) (normally 1-3 years)

Intake is normally semester A (September) and B (January/February), C (May/June).

### Academic Year 2021/22

The University's academic year is made up of 3 Semesters. Normally most undergraduate programmes use Semesters A and B, additionally postgraduate programmes and specific undergraduate programmes use Semester C. Each of these is made up of teaching weeks followed by exams (the re-sit period falls within Semester C).

- Semester A runs from Monday 27 September 2021 to Friday 21 January 2022
- Semester B runs from Monday 24 January 2022 to Friday 13 May 2022
- Semester C runs from Monday 16 May 2022 to Friday 09 September 2022
