#### Important points

The **fashion and fashion business** award is a unique course embracing an industry led Concept to Customer philosophy. Blending contemporary knowledge and skills via practical, theoretical, academic and industry focussed experiences covering topical social, environmental, political and ethical issues that inform the business of fashion.

The course enables students to learn about the fashion life cycle including product research, design and development, markets, consumer buying behaviour, business planning, financials, buying, merchandising, communication, branding and sales and marketing. The course is structured to develop students' learning about the rapidly changing face of the fashion industry, technological advances used throughout the industry, brick and mortar merchandising and the impact of digital and e-commerce. Students learn about theories and strategies and engage with industry on live projects and assignments.

Our students study in a spacious and contemporary studio with digital and 3D printers and guidance from expert tutors. Students unleash their creativity using some of the latest technology and capitalising on current and relevant industry skills and knowledge.

In their first and second years, students study alongside the BA (Hons) Fashion Design award sharing some exciting design and technical modules, understanding the fundamentals of the design process, pattern cutting and production. These are essential skills honed during the final stage of the course, putting learnt knowledge into practice.

The course prepares students for a number of related fashion careers including (but not exclusive to) Design, Garment Technology, Buying, Merchandising, Styling, Digital and E-commerce including Social Media, Content Management and Production.

### **Academic Year**

#### Academic Year 2022-23

The University's academic year is made up of 3 Semesters. For most undergraduate students the academic year is split into two Semesters (A & B). Each of these is made up of teaching weeks followed by the exam period (the re-sit period falls within Semester C)
