Important points

- The University of Hertfordshire has over 60 years' experience of teaching engineering, we

- This master's course was introduced in response to the importance of manufacturing engineers to the sector as well as recognising the strategic value of skilled operations managers.
- This course will develop skills and advance knowledge on the broad areas of business, operations management, information systems, product development and quality systems.
- The programme is offered in full-time and part-time modes.
- The typical duration of study for full-time students is:
 - Semester A (September) entry, Option 1: one calendar year, with taught modules in Semesters A and B and the individual project in Semester C.
 - Semester A (September) entry, Option 2: 18 months, with a study pattern of Semesters A and B (taught modules) and the individual project in Semester A.
 - Semester B entry (January): 18 months, with a study pattern of Semesters B, A then B.
- In a part-time mode, the programme is normally delivered over 3 years.
- Students study the same modules regardless of entry point, or whether they are studying part-time or full-time.

Academic Year

The University's academic year is made up of 3 Semesters. Normally most undergraduate programmes use Semesters A and B, additionally postgraduate programmes and specific

undergraduate programmes use Semester C. Each of these is made up of teaching weeks followed by exams (the re-sit period falls within Semester C).

Academic Year 2022 - 2023

- Semester A runs from Monday 26 September 2022 to Friday 20 January 2023
- Semester B runs from Monday 23 January 2023 to Friday 12 May 2023
- Semester C runs from Monday 15 May 2023 to Friday 08 September 2023
