Important points

- The BA Honours Business Management programme provides students with the opportunity to study across a range of business disciplines, establishing a firm grounding to pursue a wide variety of careers in business.
- The programme places a major emphasis on employability skills, and the flexibility of option choices allows students to select modules to match their skills and interests. It achieves this through a blend of academic study, intercultural awareness and employability and enterprise skills development. Business Studies students have the option to study a foreign language.
- The Business Management and Business Management 'with' pathways are designed to allow flexibility with students able to switch into a Business 'with' pathway at the start of Level 5.

Academic Year

Academic Year 2023 – 2024

The University's academic year is made up of 3 Semesters (A, B and C). Semester A and B are made up of teaching weeks followed by exams, where applicable (the re-sit period falls within Semester C). Semester C is normally used for final dissertations and projects.

- *Semester A runs from Monday 25 September 2023 to Friday 19 January 2024*
- *Semester B runs from Monday 22 January 2024 to Friday 10 May 2024*
- *Semester C runs from Monday 13 May 2024 to Friday 6 September 2024*
