## **Academic Year**

#### Academic Year 2023 - 2024

The University's academic year is made up of 3 Semesters. Normally most undergraduate programmes use Semesters A and B, additionally postgraduate programmes and specific undergraduate programmes use Semester C. Each of these is made up of teaching weeks followed by exams (the re-sit period falls within Semester C).

## The full time Pre-registration Nursing Programme begins on 11th September 2023.

## **Expected workload**

An apprenticeship nursing learner is expected to spend a minimum of 2300 hours on their studies over the programme, which will include self-directed time. In addition to this, they will also be expected to undertake a minimum of 2300 practice hours. This means that a nursing learner is expected to study (including the practice component) for at least 1533 hours each year.
