 - BSc (Hons) Sports Business Management
- This Sports Studies degree programme features a broad study of sport and considers both local and global perspectives in more depth throughout Year 2 and 3. On the Sports Studies degree programme students also have a variety of core and optional modules in Year 2 and 3 to consider.
- You will then have the opportunity to choose optional modules and tailor your degree to your own interests, including an optional Year Abroad or Sandwich Placement Year. The BSc (Hons) Sports Studies is a favoured programme for those interested in a future career in sport, and education settings.
- Sport experiences are embedded into modules and students have the opportunity to engage with various opportunities that facilitate meaningful learning experiences within sport organisations. Some sport experiences may require an enhanced Disclosure and Barring Service clearance.

Academic Year

Academic Year 2023 - 2024

The University's academic year is made up of 3 Semesters (A, B and C). Semester A and B are made up of teaching weeks followed by exams, where applicable (the re-sit period falls within Semester C). Semester C is normally used for final dissertations and projects.

Semester A runs from Monday 25 September 2023 to Friday 19 January 2024

- Semester B runs from Monday 22 January 2024 to Friday 10 May 2024
- Semester C runs from Monday 13 May 2024 to Friday 6 September 2024
