### **Important points**

- On graduation you would have covered the QAA benchmark for Law and the core
  competencies of the Foundations of Legal Knowledge required by the legal professional
  bodies in England and Wales. These include: Foundations of English law, Constitutional
  law of the UK and EU, Criminal law, Contract Law, Land Law, Tort Law and Equity. This will
  enable you to progress onto a professional legal course.
- The embedded skills framework combines legal, academic and transferable skills to ensure that our graduates are work ready.
- You will experience a flexible blended learning model with a 'flipped classroom' structure, which includes: online lectures, weekly two-hour seminars incorporating substantive law and legal skills and additional bespoke large group and one-to-one student support sessions.
- Alongside your degree, you will have the opportunity to partake in co-curricular and probono activities to enhance your legal and employment profile. These include mooting, trial advocacy, debating, mediation and participation in a wide range of activities offered by our Law Clinic.
- You will have a dedicated Academic Support Tutor who will provide academic support and pastoral guidance, including careers support, throughout your time at University.
- You will become part of a vibrant community, linking and studying with Criminology and Criminal Justice students.

#### **Academic Year**

#### Academic Year 2023 - 2024

The University's academic year is made up of 3 Semesters (A, B and C). Semester A and B are made up of teaching weeks followed by exams, where applicable (the re-sit period falls within Semester C). Semester C is normally used for final dissertations and projects.

- Semester A runs from Monday 25 September 2023 to Friday 19 January 2024
- Semester B runs from Monday 22 January 2024 to Friday 10 May 2024
- Semester C runs from Monday 13 May 2024 to Friday 6 September 2024
