Important points

- The Film Production degree provides an exciting opportunity to learn advanced producing, directing and filmmaking craft techniques, and to build professional links within the UK and international film and television industry. Through a culture of filmmaking, students will create a portfolio of shorts through weekly production and post-production activity.
- This postgraduate degree provides a practical and intensive study of filmmaking in an
 environment that encourages experimentation, professional development and new ideas.
 Students work with professional equipment and facilities and, as part of their Masters
 Degree, produce, direct or department lead their major film project with an individually
 tailored marketing and distribution strategy.
- The University of Hertfordshire film programme and post-graduate school regularly host industry professionals who lecture and conduct workshops, seminars, and tutorials. We work closely with the industry to enable students to connect directly with their future employers and mentors.
- The combination of creative, technical, practical and management skills and shared tuition with the Screenwriting pathway, in which filmmakers and screenwriters learn collaborative key skills – make this course unique and our graduates highly successful, as employees or as independent filmmakers.

Academic Year

Academic Year 2023 - 2024

The University's academic year is made up of 3 Semesters (A, B and C). Semester A and B are made up of teaching weeks followed by exams, where applicable (the re-sit period falls within Semester C). Semester C is normally used for final dissertations and projects.

- Semester A runs from Monday 25 September 2023 to Friday 19 January 2024
- Semester B runs from Monday 22 January 2024 to Friday 10 May 2024
- Semester C runs from Monday 13 May 2024 to Friday 6 September 2024
