Important points

The MSc Psychology is a programme accredited by the British Psychological Society (BPS), which is designed for students who typically have completed an undergraduate course in a non-psychology discipline but wish to retrain to become a professional (chartered) psychologist. The purpose of this programme is to provide graduates with Graduate Basis for Chartered Membership (GBC, formerly known as GBR Graduate Basis for Registration) with the British Psychological Society. This is an essential criterion for any graduate who wishes to pursue a professional career as a chartered psychologist in specialist areas such as Clinical, Forensic, Occupational, Educational or Sports Psychology.

The programme may be studied either full-time in one year or part-time over two years.

Programme-specific assessment regulations:

- As specified by the external validating body, no compensation for failed modules is permitted.
- For the final award (MSc Psychology), the project module must be included in the final degree classification.
- For the Graduate Basis for Chartered Membership with the British Psychological Society certain core modules must be passed (see Programme Specification for details).

Academic Year

Academic Year 2023 - 2024

The University's academic year is made up of 3 Semesters (A, B and C). Semester A and B are made up of teaching weeks followed by exams, where applicable (the re-sit period falls within Semester C). Semester C is normally used for final dissertations and projects.

- Semester A runs from Monday 25 September 2023 to Friday 19 January 2024
- Semester B runs from Monday 22 January 2024 to Friday 10 May 2024
- Semester C runs from Monday 13 May 2024 to Friday 6 September 2024
