### A. Programme Rationale

The School of Physics, Engineering and Computer Science offers BSc awards in Automotive Technology and Motorsport Technology. The programme has been developed to (i) satisfy the QAA Engineering Benchmark requirements (ii) to fulfil the academic requirements of UK-SPEC for IEng status and (iii) meet the professional employment needs of industry.

The technological emphasis of the Automotive Technology degree is on automotive design, chassis and powertrain technology, body engineering including materials and manufacturing methods and vehicle aerodynamics. All of these disciplines are integrated into a group design project at level 6 (Vehicle Design).

The Motorsport Technology degree varies from the automotive award as it emphasises high performance powertrains, racing car body engineering, and motorsport technology applications (including engine mapping, tyre technology, damper analysis, aerodynamics, and competitive events).

Additionally, students will study modules covering operational issues faced by managers, engineers and technologists in modern organisations. Topics will include engineering management, project management and product development, the management of innovation, reliability, organisational processes, team working and leadership, aspects of management theory and quality. Techniques and concepts such as total quality management, lean manufacturing, cost benefit analysis, the product life cycle and six sigma will be introduced.

Students will also be introduced to sustainability and the importance that engineering and technology plays in ensuring that products are designed, developed and operated with minimal impact on the environment. Students will examine issues such as minimising weight in design, technologies for alternative power



sources in vehicles, ways of minimising emissions and reducing noise, as well as aspects of re-cycling and reuse of materials.

### **B. Educational Aims of the Programme**

#### **Diversity and Inclusion**

Our programmes are purposefully designed to enable all students to engage meaningfully with the curriculum by being accessible and representative. We will support students to shape their learning experience, removing barriers and enabling them to succeed. The curriculum explicitly includes multiple and representative perspectives, valuing collective identities and individual diversity. Learning, teaching and assessment activities help students to understand how they can enhance outcomes both for themselves and for others. All students belong to a learning community, and during their studies we really want to hear their voices, encourage them to listen to others, and express themselves.

Teaching and learning methods

Acquisition of knowledge and understanding is through the following approaches:

Acquisition of A1 is through a combination of lectures, small group tutorials, coursework and laboratory work, mainly at levels 4 and 5 of the programme.

Acquisition of A2 is through a combination of lectures, projects and coursework, mainly at levels 4 and 5 of the programme.

Acquisition of A3, A4 and A5 – A8 is through lectures, projects and coursework throughout the programme and in particular at level 6.

Acquisition of A5 is through a combination of lectures, small group tutorials, coursework and computer work, mainly at levels 4 and 5 of the programme.

On this programme, staff use a range of teaching and learning strategies in the most appropriate way for each individual module. This will vary depending on the subject nature of a particular module and the level of study. A more didactic approach will tend to be adopted at lower levels, in particular for A1 and A5. An increasingly self-directed and interactive approach will be used at higher levels, particularly for A2 – A8.

Throughout, the learner is encouraged to undertake independent study both to supplement and consolidate what is being taught/learnt and to broaden their individual knowledge and understanding of the subject.

Feedback is given to all students on all work produced.

Assessment strategy

Analysis, problem solving and modelling skills are further developed through tutorial work, laboratory work and in-course exercises at levels 5 and 6 of the programme.

Design and IT skills are further developed through project work, design exercises and case studies at all levels of the programme.

Feedback is given to all students on all work produced.

Throughout, the learner is encouraged to develop intellectual skills further by independent study.

Intellectual skills are assessed as follows:

Analysis, problem solving and modelling skills (B1, B2, B5) are assessed through unseen examination papers, laboratory reports and coursework related to in-course exercises.

Design and IT skills (B3, B4) are assessed through coursework related to in-course exercises, presentations, portfolios and project reports.

### D. Programme Structures, Features, Levels, Modules, and Credits

The programme is offered in full-time (3 years), part-time (4 years at level 5 entry and 6 years at level 4 entry) and sandwich (4 years) modes and leads to the award of a BSc Degree with Honours in one of the named courses as listed in Section 1.

transferable skills by maintaining a record of evidence and completing a personal development plan.

Entry is normally at level 4 (with A-Level, or equivalent qualifications) but is possible at level 5 with suitable qualifications (e.g.an Edexcel HND in Engineering). Direct entry into level 6 is also possible, for example following successful completion of two years of a similar BSc degree programme at another HE institution. Intake is normally in Semester A.

#### **Professional and Statutory Regulatory Bodies**

The programme is accredited by the Institution of Mechanical Engineers (IMechE) for the 2023 intake.

#### Work-Based Learning, including Sandwich Programmes

A sandwich award requires the successful completion of at least 30 weeks full-time equivalent placement activity from a maximum of two separate approved placements, neither of which will be normally less than 12 weeks in duration, as defined in UPR AS11.



The placement activity will normally be completed within the United Kingdom but with approval may be completed within other countries. Progress of the student's training is monitored by visits from University academic staff. Students will be required to document this period of work in accordance with the guidelines produced by the School. Students on industrial placement will be registered on the Placement Year Module (6AAD0015).

Students who have not achieved the minimum progression requirements at the end of level 5 may be prevented from undertaking a sandwich placement. The policy relating to progression onto the placement year from level 5 is given in the School Guidelines on Industrial Placements. Additionally, students on industrial placement but who have level 4 or 5 modules to repeat, will not normally be allowed to re-enrol on these modules until they return from industrial placement. This is to avoid a conflict between UH attendance requirements and the student's commitment to their employer.

#### Study Abroad

Students may also opt to take additional studies through the Year Abroad or Semester Abroad options at a partner institution in place of the sandwich placement year, i.e. between Levels 5 and 6. To be eligible for these options students will be expected to have passed 120 credits at level 4 and 120 credits at level 5 with an average of at least 60%. In order to maintain registration with UH, students studying abroad for a full year will be registered on 6ENT0001 whilst students studying abroad for a single semester will be enrolled on 6ENT1051. In recognition of the extra study, provided a full transcript of their achievement in the host academic institution is submitted to the Board of Examiners, this will lead to an award of a BSc Degree with Honours in one of the named awards as listed in Section 1 "with Year Abroad" or "with Study Abroad" on the award.

#### **Further Features**

### Programme-specific assessment regulations

The programme complies with the University's academic regulations (in particular, <u>UPR AS11</u>, <u>UPR AS12</u> and <u>UPR AS14</u>) with the exception of those listed below, which have been approved by the University:

- Professional Statutory Regulatory Bodies thresholds will apply for accredited awards as per the
  Engineering Council Compensation and Condonement notice November 2018. To comply with
  professional body regulations students must achieve, after all available attempts under the University
  regulations, a minimum of 30% (in any allowable attempt) at levels 4, 5 and 6, before the board of
  examiners will be able to consider compensation for an accredited honours degree.
- A compensated pass cannot be awarded for BSc Individual Project (Automotive Technology)
   6ENT2050, which must be included in the calculation of degree classification. Students who do not succeed in the Individual Major Project may be eligible to repeat and will be allocated an entirely different project.
- For non-honours awards, the standard University regulations on progression and compensation shall apply, and the Programme Board of Examiners shall have discretion to transfer a student onto a nonhonours award where it is to the advantage of the student to do so (for example, where the criteria for progression on an accredited award have not been met).
