Important points

- · Students must study abroad in the second or third year (or both) in order to obtain the International Business degree, which includes English speaking nations, and others requiring language ability.
- · There is also an option to gain a dual degree on the four-year route at partner universities in Spain, Germany, France and the US where you would be based for year two and three of your degree.
- The programme provides the option to study a language in each semester, for students interested in developing their language skills further.

Academic Year

Academic Year 2024 - 2025

The University's academic year is made up of 3 Semesters (A, B and C). Semester A and B are made up of teaching weeks followed by exams, where applicable (the re-sit period falls within Semester C). Semester C is normally used for final dissertations and projects.

- Semester A runs from Monday 23 September 2024 to Friday 17 January 2025
- Semester B runs from Monday 20 January 2025 to Friday 9 May 2025
- Semester C runs from Monday 12 May 2025 to Friday 5 September 2025
