## **Concept Note**

The Sixth UN Special Thematic Session on Water and Disasters
- Connecting Midterm Reviews of Water and Disaster Risk Reduction under Climate Change The United Nations Headquarters, New York, the U.S.A.

March 21<sup>st</sup>, 2023

## 1. Background and Objective

The UN Special Thematic Sessions on Water and Disasters (STSWD) have been held biennially since 2013. The Sixth UN Special Thematic Sessions on Water and Disasters (STSWD6) – Connecting Midterm Reviews of Water and Disaster Risk Reduction under Climate Change- will be convened on March 21<sup>st</sup>, 2023, right before the UN 2023 Water Conference to make inputs to its discussion and outcomes while pursuing its ongoing objective of raising awareness and promoting actions for building back better towards more resilient, sustainable, and inclusive society in the post-COVID-19 era by addressing the issues of water and disasters as well as other development issues, such as urbanization, food, and environment under climate change. The special focus of this edition is to connect Midterm Review of Water Action Decade and that of disaster risk reduction (DRR) under the context of Climate Change.

The Covid-19 pandemic, climate change, and recurrent disasters have stunned sustainable development of countries, casting blight onto the world. Negative impacts of those mega disturbances are felt in every corner of the world. They have taught us a hard lesson on the contemporary nature of risk: our global world is highly interconnected and equally fragile, presenting serious consequences for our societies' health, food security, peace, and stability.

Recovery from the COVID-19 pandemic and ensuring a livable future for the next generations under climate change and disasters requires transformation into quality-oriented societies that are sustainable, resilient, and inclusive. It is vital to raise political awareness and share the experiences and good practices with practical guidance amongst leaders, private sector, civil society and all stakeholders to build back stronger from devastation of the catastrophes that are still impacting people and society, especially the poor.

STSWD6 will keep momentum of the previous Sessions in raising high-level political awareness and urging actions on the issues of water and disasters among UN member states. The Session will focus on connecting priority issues and actions on Midterm Review of Water Action Decade and that of disaster risk reduction (DRR) under the context of climate change reflecting various lessons of COVID-19 and promoting actions to realize a sustainable, resilient and climate adaptive society in the post-COVID-19. The session will be contribution to UN 2023 Water Conference to be held right after STSWD6 and other major events on water, disaster risk reduction, climate change and relevant topics, including the High-Level Meeting of the General Assembly on the Midterm Review of the Implementation of the Sendai Framework for Disaster Risk Reduction 2015-2030 in May 2023; UN High-level Political Forum on Sustainable Development (HLPF) in July 2023; and the UN Climate Change Conference as well as Biodiversity Conference.
