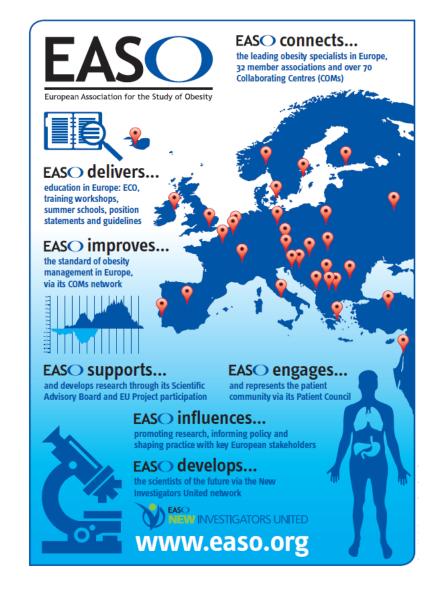

- O EASO promotes action through collaboration in **research**, **education and policy**.



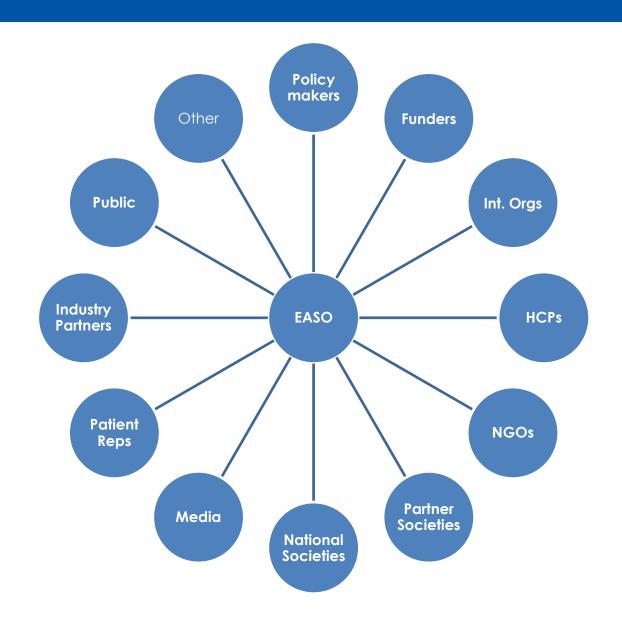


EASO Objectives

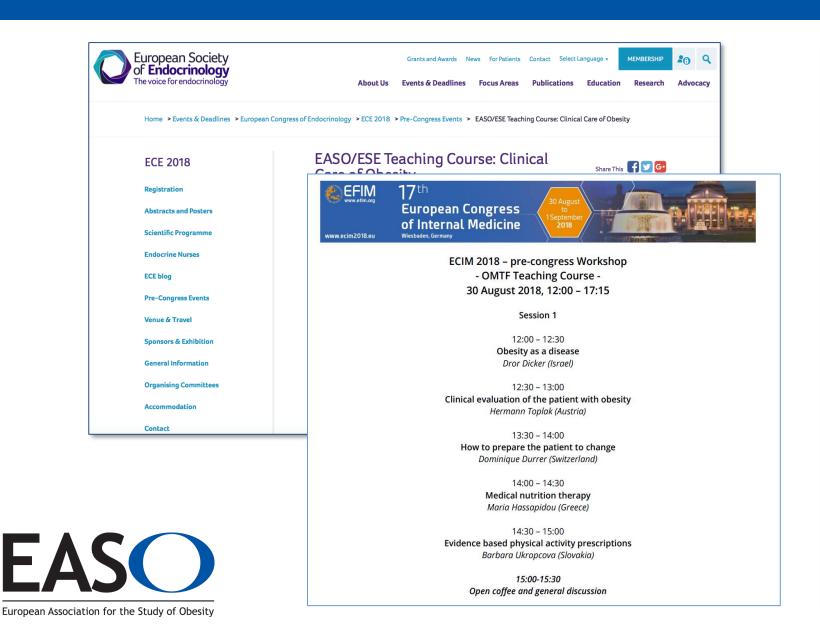

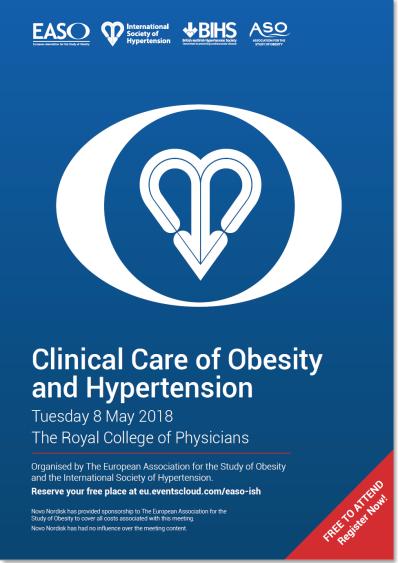

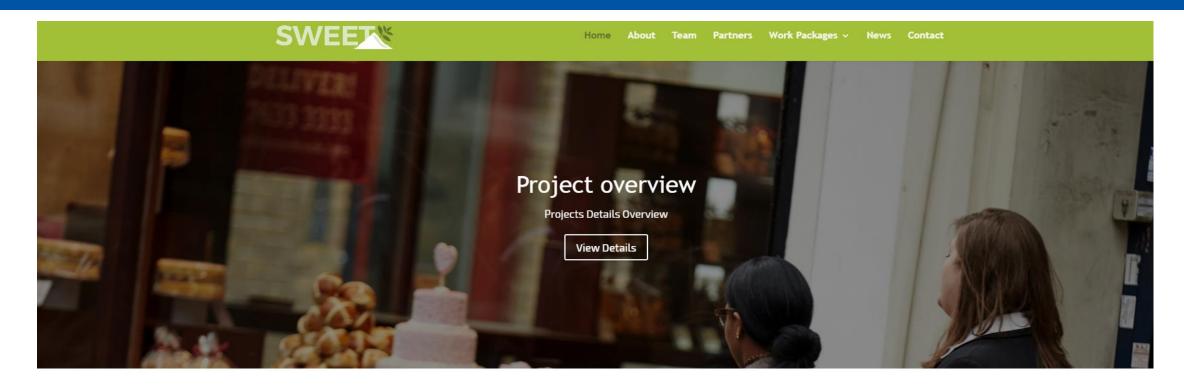


WHAT IS THE PROTEIN PROJECT?

PROTEIN is a research initiative led by a consortium of European public- and privatesector organizations working to promote health and wellbeing. By bringing together
experts from across Europe, PROTEIN will develop tools using the latest communications
technologies and machine learning strategies to provide personalized nutrition and
physical activity support to EU citizens. PROTEIN has received funding from the
European Union's Horizon 2020 Research and Innovation programme under grant
agreement No 817732.



EASO Research: SWEET



SWEET, a European Commission Horizon 2020 funded project, is supported by a consortium of 29 pan-European research, consumer and industry partners, who will develop and review evidence on long term benefits and potential risks involved in switching over to sweeteners and sweetness enhancers (S&SEs) in the context of public health and safety, obesity, and sustainability.

The 5 year multidisciplinary project engages stakeholders from across the food chain — consumers, patients, health professionals, scientists, policy makers, and regulators — to address the role of sweeteners in weight control, and potentially move viable products to market. Stakeholders, including consumers, patients, health professionals, scientists, policy makers, and regulators will engage in the project.

Abstract

The first contact for patients with obesity for any medical treatment or other issues is generally with General Practitioners (GPs). Therefore, given the complexity of the disease, continuing GPs' education on obesity management is essential. This article aims to provide obesity management guidelines specifically tailored to GPs, favouring a practical patient-centred approach. The focus is on GP communication and motivational interviewing as well as on therapeutic patient education. The new guidelines highlight the importance of avoiding stigmatization, something frequently seen in different health care settings. In addition, managing the psychological aspects of the disease, such as improving self-esteem, body image and quality

unhealthy food to children. In conjunction with the UK All Party Parliamentary Group on Obesity (APPG on Obesity), the campaign urges Government to enact a 9pm watershed on advertising "junk food," to reduce advert exposure to children - on TV, online, in the streets and on public transport - to make it easier for children and their families to make healthier food choices.

Given what we know about behavioural science, constant exposure to these marketing cues erodes healthconscious decision making around food choices and undermines other public health efforts to drive consumers to make healthier choices.

CECON 2017: report from Alexandra Fraisova, EASO Patient Council



The 6th Central European Congress on Obesity (CECON 2017) was held October 5 to October 7, 2017, in Bratislava, Sllovakia. I was pleased to represent the EASO Patient Council at the meeting and delivered a talk on using the Internet to help with weight loss and weigh maintenance.

The topics covered at the meeting in Bratislava were interesting and vide-ranging, EASO President Professor Hermann Topids keptoe about work of EASO in central Europe and across the continent. Following presentations and some discussion about obesity in Central Europe, there were expert presentations from ventrum faulte.

A very interesting session focused on trends in bariatric surgery. There was interest in treatment of diabetes — including physical activity in management of type 2 diabetes, the panel discussion included focus on diabetes prevention and it appears that there is more interesting research in the pipeline.

As obesity is a risk factor for several co-morbidities, sessions were also dedicated to this theme.

One key focus of the Bratislava Congress was childhood obesity, which is a rising challenge in Central Europe and around the continent. Several child obesity prevention programmes were presented, including the GYERE programme in Hungary, and Maria Luger's work in Austria, several school based initiatives in Slovakia and the Childhood Obesity Surveillance Initiative (COSI) in the Czech Republic.

The final session of the congress was dedicated to nutrition and cognitive behavioural therapy in obesity

Building a system of weight management and care in Reykjavik: Erla Sveinsdóttir and Heilsuborg



Founded by a general practicioner and a physipotherapist, Heilsuborg started eight years ago as a small fitness center in Reykjavik. With a clear vision and hard work, Heilsuborg has evolved into a multi-disciplinary centre for the prevention and treatment of lifestyle - related diseases

Obesity has been a primary focus of Heilsuborg from the beginning; combining support for the body and nourishment for the soul in one location makes it an ideal environment for treating obesity. In August 2017, Heilsuborg took a major step, moving to a newly renovated, bespoke – and much larger – location that presents many options for consumers and possibilities for the future.

Erla Gerður Sveinsdóttir trained as a GP and holds a masters degree in public health. Upon graduation, she worked for many years in primary care and in two major rehabilitation centres in Iceland. As her interest in preventing and treating obesity developed, she identified a need for a destination where people would be able to receive high quality, comprehensive and multi-disciplinary support in cultivating a healthier lifestyle. She envisioned a place where people could access state-of-the-art health education, training, support and treatment. It was on this foundation that Heilsuborg was founded.
