Lunch boxes can be provided at a cost of £7.50 per pupil. Please phone in advance to arrange.

Accompanying adults are free of charge in the following ratios: 1 adult to to 5 pupils for Primary 1–2; 1 adult to 8 pupils for Primary 3–7; 1 adult to 10 pupils for Secondary Schools. Additional adults will be charged at the standard rate of admission. Payment is made on the day by cash, card or cheque. **Please note we cannot invoice schools.**

Availability

All visits must be booked in advance, including self-led visits to the site. School programming is available February to December. We strongly advise booking more than 1 month in advance as availability can vary.

Travel Subsidy
