

# CAMRA's advice for being a responsible pub goer in Scotland

Now that pubs have re-opened, we're enjoying getting back to our locals, having a pint and enjoying the social aspects of pub going.

Things look and feel a little different to before. That's why we've put together our advice on how you can use pubs responsibly and safely.

## Who you can go to the pub with:

- Up to six people from different households, both indoors and outdoors (under 12s don't count towards the total)

## Be a responsible pub goer by:

- Wearing a face covering when entering or leaving the venue, and when moving around inside
- Listening to the staff and following instructions on signs
- Waiting patiently in queues
- Washing your hands or using hand sanitising stations
- Staying in your allocated seating area as much as possible
- Using contactless payments if requested
- Considering ordering remotely (e.g. through an app or website) where this option is provided

## A few do's and don'ts

- Do go back to the pub where you can – pubs are safe, regulated places to socialise if you follow the rules
- Do give your contact details to help with track and trace
- Don't sing or shout, to help prevent the spread of COVID-19
- Don't come to the pub if you, or someone in your household or support bubble has symptoms of COVID-19 – stay at home and follow NHS advice
- Don't risk getting your local into trouble with the authorities by breaching rules – many of them are now legal requirements

Please note that this advice is correct at the time of issue but does not take into account where local lockdown restrictions are in place which prevent pubs opening for on sales, or restrict different households from socialising in any circumstances.
